David Syzdek Named New Milford Public Schools Teacher of the Year



High School Band Director David Syzdek has been named as New Milford Public Schools Teacher of the Year for 2018-19. The district honored Mr. Syzdek at its opening convocation on August 27, 2018. "My message to teachers is simple and the same as it is to my students," said Mr. Syzdek. "What you do in the classroom each and every single day matters. Don't ever think that what you do is not important."

Mr. Syzdek has taught Music at New Milford High School since 2010. He is the conductor of the Wind Ensemble, Concert Band and Orchestra as well as the director of the Jazz Band and Marching Band. The concert ensembles from New Milford High School have performed at some of the most prestigious venues in the country including Carnegie Hall in New York City, Washington D.C. and Symphony Hall in Boston. The Marching Band has competed and performed around the country including in the USBands National Championships at Met Life Stadium in New Jersey, Walt Disney World in Florida, the New York City Veterans Day Parade and the Hollywood Christmas Parade in California.



Mr. Syzdek received both his Bachelor of Arts degree in Music and his Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education from the University of Connecticut in 2003. He graduated from the University of Connecticut in May of 2006 with his Master of Music degree in Conducting. In graduate school, David studied with Dr. Jeffrey Renshaw and Dr. David Mills while conducting the University of Connecticut Symphonic Band. David was also a Graduate Assistant for the University of Connecticut

Bands where he worked directly with the Marching Band and was a Pep Band Director for basketball.

In speaking about his teaching style, Mr. Syzdek said, "One of the greatest lessons I learned from my mentor in music, the Director of Bands at the University of Connecticut Dr. David Mills, is that each and every single student is important, matters, and plays a crucial role in determining the success of the ensemble. I have truly taken this lesson



to heart and do my very best to pass this on to my own students. In a large group, a hundred or more students as in my band, it is all too easy for the individual to think that what they do or don't do will make a difference to the overall performance. Nothing could be farther from the truth. The success of the group is totally dependent upon each person performing at their very best each time there is an opportunity to perform."

Nominations for Mr. Syzdek speak to his dedication and rapport with students:

"Mr. Syzdek's teaching philosophy is that no show is ever perfect, and that goes for him as well as for the kids. He says they will always finish even their finest, winning performance knowing one small thing they could improve upon. Yet, somehow, in teaching them to strive for that elusive perfection, he teaches them to value themselves and to be proud each time they give their very best. He strikes the perfect balance for teenagers who are still developing their fragile egos, as performers, and as young men and women."

"Mr. Syzdek motivates his students by believing in them. He sets the bar quite high. He is able to strike a balance between being a friend and mentor to his students, one who takes an interest in their personal lives, and remaining an upstanding role model who expects them to conduct themselves honorably and perform at their best. You can't spend as many hours with high school kids, as he does, without also providing them with a shoulder to lean on and an occasional nudge in the right direction, something he does so well."



Of his work with the different student ensembles, Mr. Syzdek talked about the development of his students, "There is something special about a group of high school students coming together, united in one goal of performing music at the highest level and learning how to work together as a group. While we concentrate on the specifics of performing music, the lessons learned along the way carry over to many aspects of life. Hard work, time management and working with others are key experiences my students have that lead to many different opportunities in the years to come."

Parents, students and fellow staff members are invited to nominate a teacher for selection as New Milford's Teacher of the Year in May of each year. The nominee must have taught in the district for five or more years and have demonstrated continued excellence of performance during his/her tenure. Nomination forms will go out in the spring.

A Message from Dr. Stephen Tracy, Interim Superintendent of Schools

Let me take this opportunity to thank the Board of Education and the many parents and staff members who have gone out of their way to welcome me back to New Milford over the past month. As some of you know, it was my privilege to serve as New Milford's Superintendent of Schools for several years back in in the 1980's and 1990's. My family and I made our home here for some eighteen years — so my three sons consider this to be their "home town". It has been a real treat to reacquaint myself with some of the educators who served with me during those earlier days and



to meet the many dedicated men and women who have joined the faculty in the intervening years.

One of our most significant obligations as a school system is to encourage children and young people to think about their futures and to take positive steps toward the lives that they hope to build for themselves. In that regard, I have found the work of the late William Glasser to be particularly useful. Dr. Glasser is the creator of a psychological model known as *Choice Theory*. An important aspect of *Choice Theory* is a counseling technique that involves four simple but profound questions. I share them with you here with the thought that you may find them useful in helping your children to deal with the challenges that they face as they grow and learn:

1. What do you want?

As simple as this question appears, it can have profound implications. What do you want for yourself with respect to your education? What do you want out of this school? What do you want out of a relationship that is important to you? What do you want for your career, for your future?

2. What are you doing to get what you want?

This question reflects Dr. Glasser's belief that the only person who can truly direct and control someone's behavior is that individual themself. It is a powerful message of individual power and responsibility.

3. How is it going?

Are the things that you are choosing to do moving you closer to the people, the experiences and the things that you want out of life? Are you happy with the way things are going for you?

4. Are you prepared to change your behavior in order to get closer to what you want? If you would like to be a happier, more successful, more powerful person, are you prepared to change your behavior in order to do so? The answer to this question is both liberating and challenging. Liberating in the sense that we experience the freedom that comes with knowing that we have the capability of setting our own course in life. Challenging in that it is always up to us to do so.

Please extend to your children my best wishes for every success as they continue their education here in New Milford. Make it a great year!


Nominations for NMPS Stars of the Month are NOW OPEN!


