510.1L STUDENT ORGANIZED SOCIAL EVENTS

A. PARTIES AND SOCIAL EVENTS

The elementary school principal and teachers will set up a list of special days when they will have parties in their rooms. All such parties will be conducted during the school day under the supervision of the teacher.

Whenever possible, we encourage the scheduling of events in high school on Friday or Saturday evenings. Each class may have two parties during the school year. Other organizations may have social functions. Arrangements as to the time and place shall be cleared through the principal's office, who may set up rules as deemed necessary within board policy.

The time for closing parties in the junior high during the week shall be 9:00 PM and for the senior high 10:00 PM. When held on Friday or Saturday, the time shall be one hour later in each case.

The use of the school facilities for non-school functions shall be arranged for through the superintendent's office.

B. SCHOOL DANCES

Each request for a school dance (including requests by a class or club) must be approved by the school administration in advance of the event, including:

- 1. Admission charge to be made.
- 2. Who is to be admitted.
- 3. Beginning and closing time of the dance.
- 4. Who is to supervise the dance, be responsible for school property, and for conformance to regulations governing the dance
- 5. School dances will be open to students in grades 9-12 and their guests outside the school system (who must be approved by the sponsoring group and the High School Principal, if the dance is not a closed dance.) 7-9 parties must conform to the same regulations except they are closed dances and open to grades 7-9. No school dance will be approved to run later than 10 PM on a night preceding a school day or 11 PM on any other night. No party will be approved to run later than 9 PM on a night preceding a school day or 10 PM on any other night.
- 6. Changes as to times and groupings may be made by the administration.

C. JUNIOR - SENIOR BANQUET AND PROM

Juniors and Seniors enrolled in the New York Mills School and others invited by the Junior Class will be guests of the Junior Class. Payment must be made to the Junior Class in advance for the proportionate share of the banquet expenses for all others permitted to attend. The banquet and prom may be held only on school premises.

D. CANOE TRIPS

A canoe trip by any school-affiliated group will not be permitted.

E. HAY RIDES

Hayrides by any school-affiliated group will not be permitted. Only trips or activities covered by school insurance and not considered hazardous to participants will be approved.

F. CAR WASH

A car wash by any school-affiliated group will not be permitted.
