April 29th meeting: Item 5.G - Go to 1:06:42 for the beginning of the executive session (just so you can hear the reason for exec session).

Then **go to 1:29:54** back in session and “motion to approve the settlement agreement negotiated with the plaintiffs in Equality v. Hoffman which requires the board to initiate rulemaking proceedings to repeal Arizona administrative code R7-2-303, subpart A.3.b.v

Item 5.H AMENDED Presentation, discussion and possible action to open rulemaking procedures for R72303 Sex Education Start time 1:30:41

Approved unanimously in less than a minute **stopped at 1:31:27**

What I found curious is that the amended rule was already presented for review with the language ~~Promote honor and respect for monogamous heterosexual marriage~~; already stricken from the rule. How could this amended document be presented this way as part of the agenda if the executive session hadn't yet occurred? (This meeting was on the 29th and the house and senate approved SB1346 on April 11th. Is this more shenanigans??)

May 20th meeting: There are actually 2 videos and I think there is information in both you should hear. In the hour long video **item 5.D is the motion to close rulemaking procedures R7-2-303 Sex Education and starts at minute 28:40**. This is when Armondo Ruiz gives his compelling reason for voting no. It's about 7 minutes long. You can't really see Ruiz but Hoffman can't take her eyes off of him. Near the end of his comments I don't think should even blink. His comments **end at 35:39**. Then Hoffman **speaks at 35:44**. This is where she requested that the board open rulemaking again in June “so we can put all ideas on the table and make sure that we continue to improve upon this”. With this request from Hoffman shouldn't R7-2-303 be back on the June 24th agenda?

Welborn starts to speak at **minute 36:26** and make a good point about maybe it's time to take a look at the entire standards. **Ends at 39:06**.

The second video is 22 minutes long and discusses the new position at the Dept of Ed. The “first in the nation” *Associate Superintendent of Equity Diversity and Inclusion*. **Minutes start at 11:24 and end at 12:20**. This new leadership role is to “*guide our department to better serve under-represented, marginalized and at-risk students and their families*”. Applications were accepted through May 24th and Hoffman was excited that this person would also “*be helping us support equitable practices both internally and externally and help us have more equitable practices in our department and we are very excited to have this new position*”.

The other part of the meeting I was worried about was the discussion of Hoffman's creation of the **School Safety Task Force starting at minute 13:50**. She worked on this with Brophy McGee and Rep. Hernandez and the Students March for Life (?????) to bring “*diverse voices together to find solutions to help school districts and LEA's regarding school safety issues*”. You can listen to who she wants to have included in the conversation (no faith based groups and no pro 2nd amendment groups) **Ends at 15:28**.
