- I thought they would notice I was missing and drive back to get me. But they didn't!


I waited all morning before I realized I had to do something.

I talked to Lulu for hours.


Her name was Lulu, and she made traveling fun. Lulu gave me all the news of the road. She kept me from worrying about my lost family.

"Sorry, Lulu," I said. "But I've got a family of my own to find. Thanks for the lift!"


And I hopped out.

- As the sun came up, I heard a voice yell out, "Welcome to Little Rock!"


"Good luck in the Big Apple!" I said to Frankie. And I hopped out of the train.

But it didn't matter. I was heading home with my family.


Trina hugged me all the way home!
