I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will encompass areas of science that deal with environmental issues. The goal of environmental science is to help the students develop conceptual thinking in the most rapidly changing area of science. Emphasis will be placed on developing and understanding concepts not only in technically, but also in practical field applications. The student will develop the ability to recognize unifying themes and use critical thinking to address today's major environmental concerns. The areas of study will include scientific principles, human population resources and sustainability, environmental quality and pollution, biodiversity vs. urban development, and society and the environment.
