Evaline Reopening

Next week we will start having students return to face to face learning. We will begin with Kindergarten and First Grade students in their classroom 2 days a week, using a half day schedule the first week. (8:30-11:30). Each week we will add additional grades to our schedule until all grades are included. Here are some specifics to help your families get ready for this adjustment. We will be continuing to update you on additional information as it becomes available.

What to Bring: backpack, charged chromebook and cord, headphones, water bottle, mask, ((K-1) a change of clothes), school supplies including workbooks. We recommend students have two sets of some supplies so they're not packing them to and from school.(ex. Pencils, erasers, scissors, color crayons, etc.) Please let your students' teacher know if you have questions or need assistance with this. Please do not bring trinkets or toys to school per safety protocols.

Bus Schedule/Protocols:

- 1. **Beginning October 12th**, the bus will run on its regular schedule Monday through Thursday. **The bus will not run next week for K-1 half days due to low ridership.** You may see the bus stop or drive by your house even if it is not your day to attend school. The bus route is attached to this email. Please note that we will follow the schedule as closely as possible, but trains and slow borders may impact the schedule. Please have your child(ren) ready at their designated bus stop 5 minutes prior to pick up time, and like- wise plan to be at their drop off stop 5 minutes prior to drop off.
- 2. **ATTESTATION ON THE BUS**: Students will be expected to wear a mask and have a completed attestation slip to turn in to the bus aide when they get on the bus. We will be sending yellow booklets of these home in our distance learning packets/at lunch deliveries and have them available as well to pick up at school at the pick up/drop off table at our front door beginning next week.
- 3. **SEATING:** Students have assigned seats by family group. The assignments will be organized so that the first students on the bus will sit in the furthest seat in the back, and fill from there forward. This will keep students from passing by other students as they enter. The family groups will have distance between them. Windows will be slightly open to help with ventilation. The bus will be sanitized after each trip.

Distance Learners: Effective 10/26, as we transition to primarily face to face learning, the distance learning being offered will no longer be identical to how it was prior to this transition. Students will receive packets and/or work connected to/ outlined on their learning platforms. Video lessons, if present, may be modified as compared to prior to this transition and videos will not be required by the teachers, unless they are considered essential for completing the required learning tasks as determined by the teaching staff. Packets will be provided for pick-up at Evaline only, and parents will be responsible to hand deliver them into the designated drop off crate at Evaline.

Lunch & Packet delivery: Lunch & Packet delivery will continue only until 10/26/20, at an adjusted time between 10-11:30AM. Please update the school if your lunch needs change. Beginning 10/26/20 lunches & packets will be only available at the school site for pick up as we adjust our staffing to meet the changing needs of our student body. Lunches will remain free at this time.

Masks: Masks are required for anyone to enter or remain in the school building unless they have a doctor's note allowing for an alternate safety option. If a student is unable or unwilling to wear a mask they are still able to participate in learning at Evaline School using the distance learning resources. We will be providing "Mask Breaks" to assist with the adjustment to wearing masks for a longer period of time.

Student Drop Off: For the first week of school and for parents who are choosing to drop off their students to do so between 8:15-8:25 using the front driveway loop, following the signs posted. We will try to have staff out initially to help direct traffic. Students will be dropped off at either the office door for Grades 3 and 4 or the front door for gradesK,1,2,5 and 6. Please drop them off with their completed health attestation slip from the packet you will be receiving at pick up/ drop off next week. The bus will arrive at 8:30AM. When the bus arrives, any drop off students not having exited their vehicles yet, will need to wait in their vehicles until the bus has been fully unloaded and moved while the passengers are checked in by family group. Do not unload your vehicle during this time, please wait in your vehicle until you can pull up to your student's entrance. You will be

the bus and have it depart before we begin to send students out to cars for pick up due to necessary safety protocols. We will begin loading the bus prior to 2pm to allow the bus to have a planned departure time of 2pm. We will then plan to start dismissal of students by family group to the Home Line beginning at 2:05pm. We ask that you not arrive to line up until at least 2pm, and that you line up using the front loop only. We will have signs to help with this process as well as extra staff at first as needed. We will have staff monitoring the traffic and will be making the necessary adjustments in our schedule and logistics over time for student pick up as we see how the process is going. We ask that you remain in your vehicles for both drop off and pick up, and that you give at least a 1 hour notice for any change to a prearranged plan for bus versus pickup / drop off plan due to safety and logistical reasons.

<u>Attestation Yellow Slips -Temperature Check</u>

We will be sending home **attestation booklets** for each student for parents/guardians to fill out at home and simply send to school with their student. The student can then hand the slip to a staff member at the door at drop off or to a and the staff member will then do a temperature check. Once inside students will be required to wash their hands as their first task of the day. We request parents remain in cars and cars remain in line until initial temperatures are taken for the student(s) from that car, in case there becomes a need to have a student(s) go directly home. We ask for patience during this process, and we believe it will get faster over time. We are hoping this entire process will make for a smoother and safer transition into the school. If you have any questions you can message your student's teacher or call the school.

4th on A/B Schedule

5th/6th continue current distance learning plan

Week 4 (10/26-10/30)

K/1 Full days 8:25-2:00, A/B schedule 2nd and 3rd grades on A/B schedule 4th on A/B schedule 5th/6th on A/B schedule

Second graders' Student Superpower of the Week was "Good Judgement." Our mantra was, "Make smart choices based on what you know is right." We also discussed how prioritising, meeting deadlines, and carefully planning are components of good judgement. Flnally, we decided that good judgement helps us to make decisions that consider the future.

Please encourage your child to use his/her weekly task sheets to drive their daily schedule and to clarify assignments. Students may need a parent or guardian to go over each subject for the day with them to ensure assignments have been completed. It is really important that students write their first and last name on each assignment.

Online assignments are also important to complete: ixl, Epic, and AR were carefully selected because of their academic benefits and the support they offer to students. Packets and assignments are due by 3:00 pm on Fridays so that I have time to review work and provide feedback to students and families in a timely manner.

Hello Families.

I am seeing an increased amount of work completed by students and turned in. Keep up the great work! Although some students will be returning to class shortly students will still be doing at home learning as well, so it is important to keep those routines and expectations established.

Our Fabulous 4th graders!

This week we have really stepped up the pace and progress in 4th Grade, having completed our fall assessments, delving deeper into learning about the Constitution in Social Studies, preparing for our first math test of the year, and learning more about narrative writing while reading our second ELA story.



We have been studying the topic of Germs and Strategies for staying healthy in Health class, and have had the opportunity to learn more about the piano, yoga poses, and how to draw a marvelous cat! So though it has been a bit more challenging with an increase in work, It has also been a pretty fun week too!

We have noticed our 4th graders getting more comfortable and successfully using our learning platform, and the intervention programs we have included in our class day, which is great. It is critical however, that they continue to follow the daily schedule and complete each task listed, as each task will be the foundation for the next one presented, and getting caught up after getting behind can be a challenge. Please encourage your student's to watch and rewatch the videos uploaded onto Classdojo, and to ask us questions they may have about an assignment or a concept using ClassDojo or in our listed daily zoom sessions as needed. When the work is completed, please make sure it is submitted either by using their return envelope or by using Classdojo so we can grade it, and provide feedback. One quick way to get feedback from us is to submit a picture of the completed work onto ClassDojo and we can usually review it and offer feedback within 24 hours. As a side note, submitting a blank worksheet does not count for submitting an assignment, and by not doing the assignment they are missing out on learning and practicing a key concept, so please encourage your student to try their best on each page, and to let us know if they need any help or clarification.

Also, If your student has arranged to come in for extra support, please make sure they bring their current learning packet, and their assigned Chromebook with the power cord so that we have the resources we need to provide the planned support.
