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What is Title I?

J.R. Trippe Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how J.R. Trippe Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. J.R. Trippe Middle School values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goals of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that J.R. Trippe Middle School will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

J.R. Trippe Middle School invited all parents to attend our annual School Orientation/Open House at the beginning of the school year (August 2019). A presentation of our parent engagement policy, our schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact were introduced so that parents could provide input and feedback. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and provide feedback throughout the year. Our annual survey announcement is sent home by students and the survey is available online for parents to participate. The annual survey provides valuable information for our school plan as well as insight in how to use the funds for family engagement. Throughout the year, parents are encouraged to provide feedback during several parent meetings and activities. Parents receive notification of meetings and activities in several ways including the school website, our Facebook page, and announcements sent home by the students. In addition, feedback is provided through parent and community members during School Governance Council meetings.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. J.R. Trippe Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

The Parent and Family Engagement Policy and Plan is found on our school website, on our Facebook page, and is sent home to all parents of students at J.R. Trippe Middle School. Copies of the plan are available in the office of our school.
