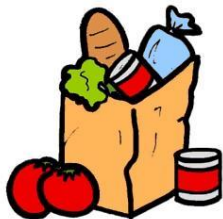


SVDP MEETING: The next meeting will be held Sunday, March 21st after Mass.

SWIECONKA (sh-vee-en-soon-kah) is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions. Baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin and decorated with sprigs of boxwood (*bukszpan*), the typical Easter evergreen. This food is shared on Easter morning in a ritual breaking of the fast. Observing the beautiful foods and creations of other parishioners is one of the special joys of the event. Bishop Steven Raica will bless Easter Baskets at 9:00 am Holy Saturday at the Cathedral of St. Paul. All are welcome.
