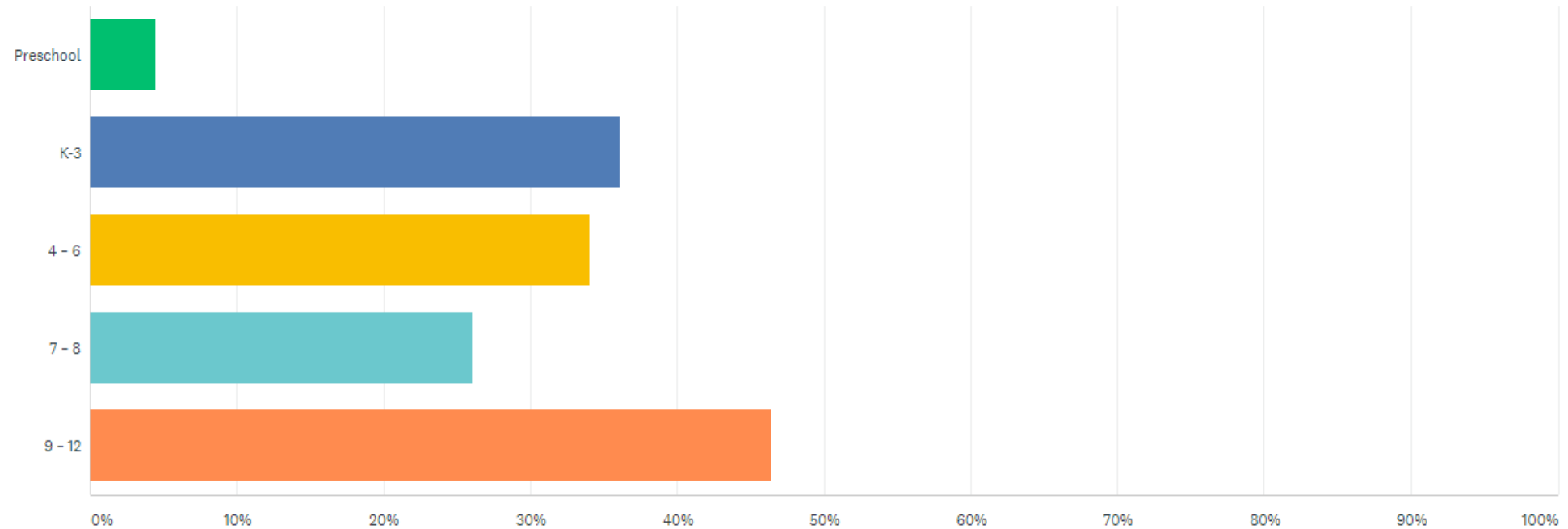

My child/ children represent the following grade levels (check all that apply):

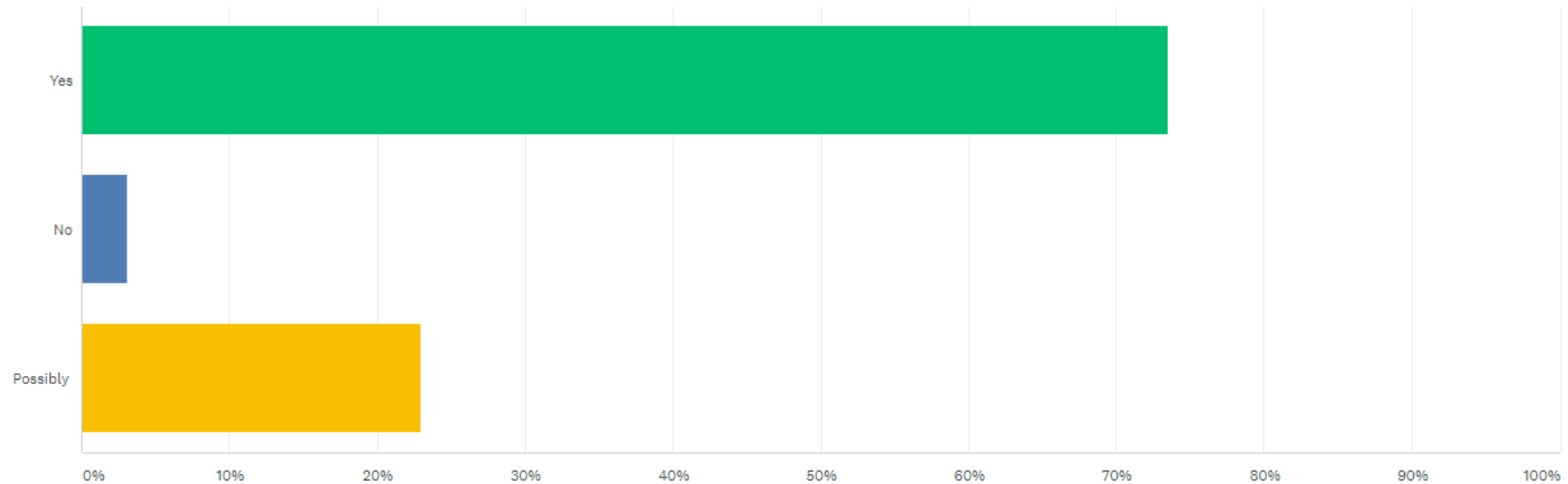

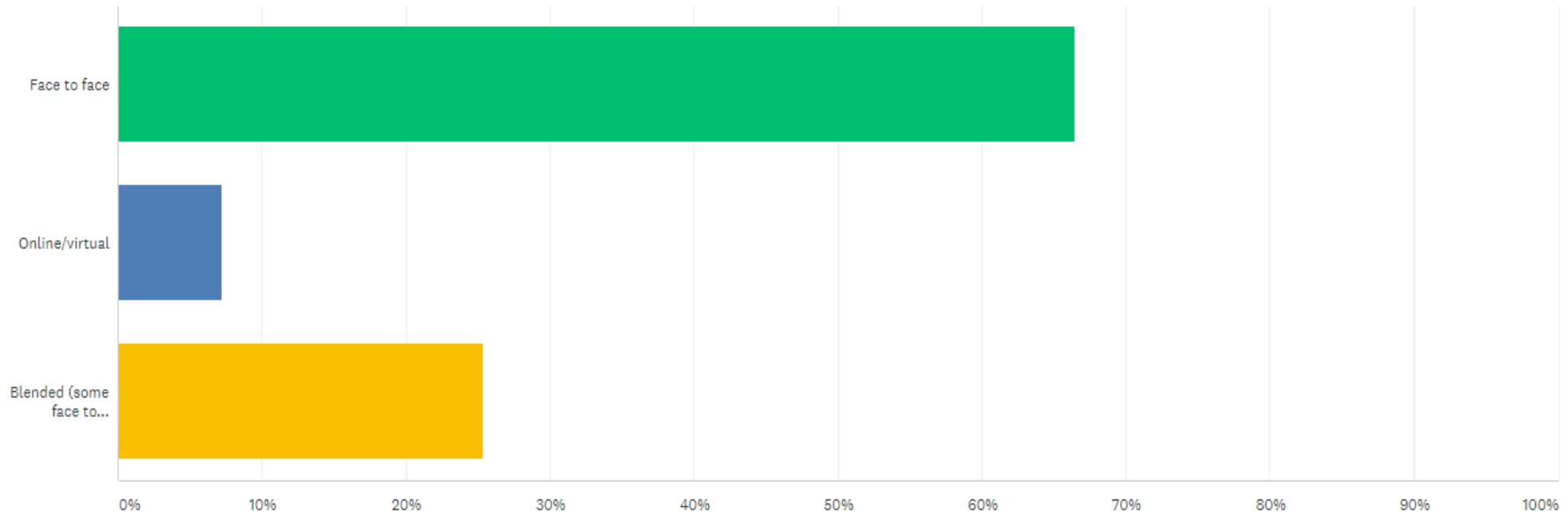

As we reopen, would you prefer your child come to school for face to face instruction or work online?

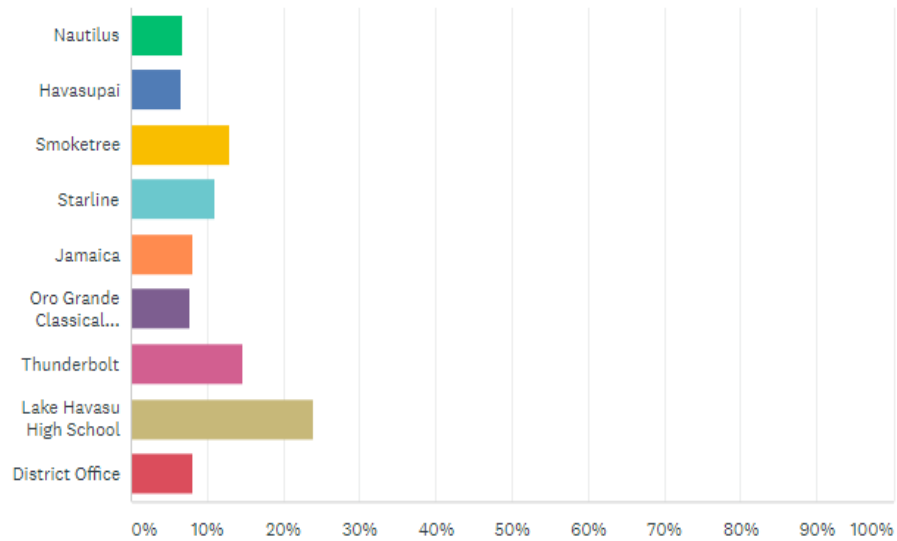

Answered: 308 Skipped: 0

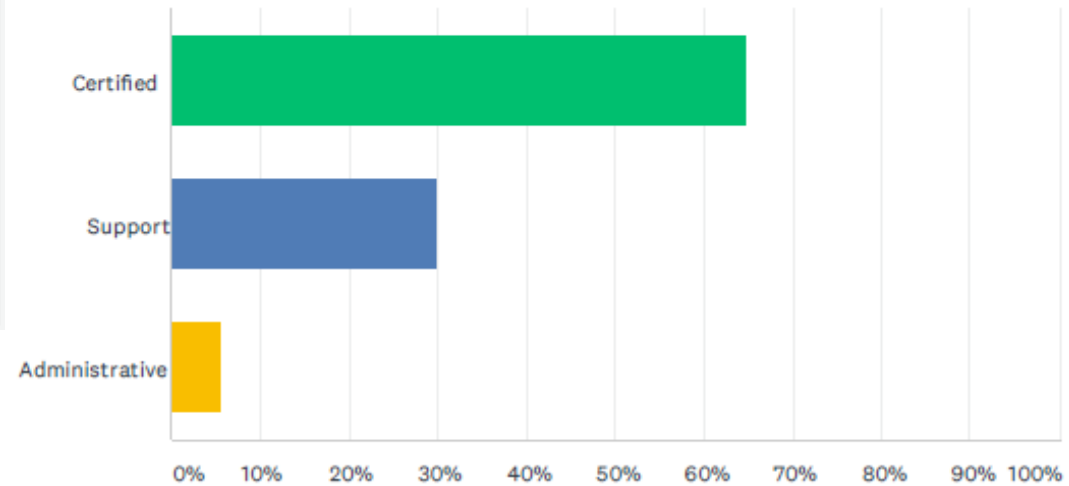

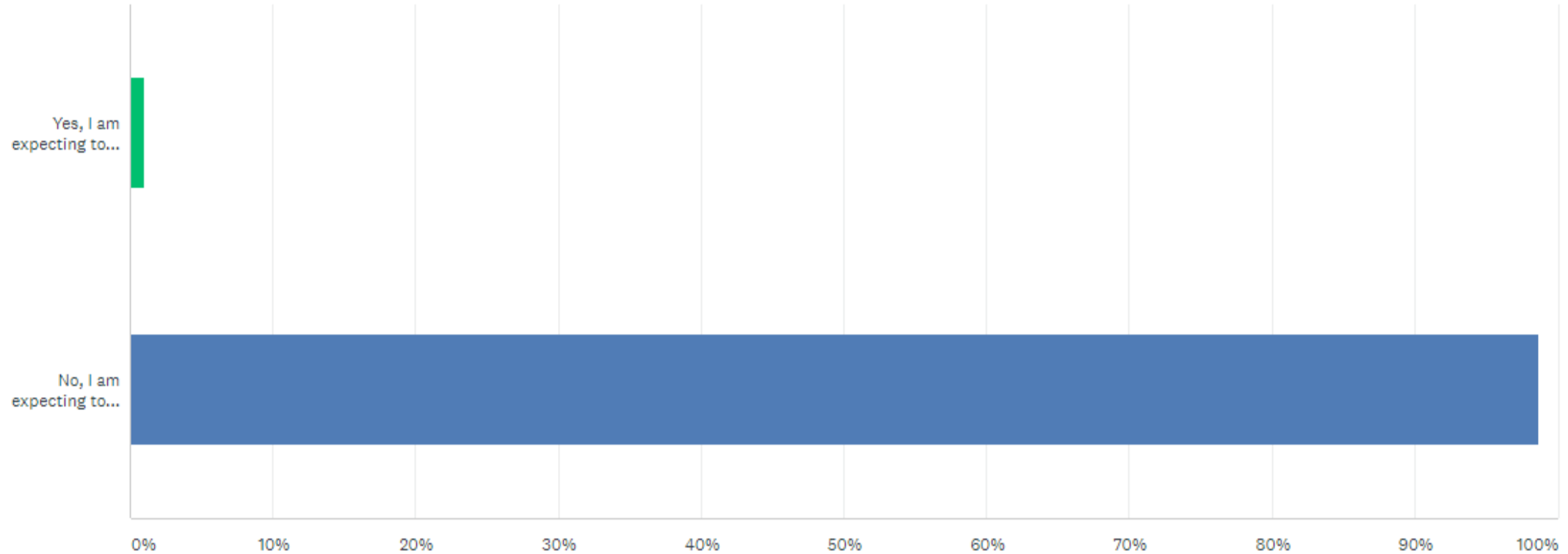

# Options for Education

- In Person Learning
  - PK-12
  - 5 days per week
  - Recess
  - Lunch
  - Specials
  - Participation in athletics/clubs/activities



# Options for Education

- Online Learning
  - K-12
  - 5 days per week
  - Supervised by a district teacher
    - Required daily online time
    - New content/instruction
    - Increased work time and expectations
    - Graded work and assessments
  - Participation in athletics/clubs/activities

# Other Opportunities

- Athletics
  - High School Athletics will follow the AIA guidelines
  - Middle School Athletics will be suspended for the first semester
- Clubs/Activities
  - In person after school clubs/activities and large gathering school events will be suspended for the first quarter unless they meet the physical distancing requirements
  - Virtual events will be encouraged
- Field Trips
  - Field trips are suspended for the first semester

# Additional Safety Measures

- Building Entry
  - Entry access will be limited to no more than 4 areas per school
  - Parents will be asked to remain in their cars during parent drop off
  - Visitors/Volunteers will be limited to those who directly serve students
- Cleaning
  - All frequently touched surfaces are cleaned at least daily per CDC guidelines
- Handwashing
  - Upon entering the building
  - Before and after lunch, recess, and specials
  - After using the restroom
- Cover coughs and sneezes
- Physical distancing
  - To the extent feasible
- Face Coverings
  - All staff and students are welcome to, but not required to wear face coverings

# Student and Staff Health

- **If students or staff are sick we ask that they stay home**
  - Prior to school check for the following symptoms:
    - Fever 100.4 or higher
    - Trouble breathing/respiratory issues
    - Coughing
- **If students or staff develop symptoms at school:**
  - They will report to the nurses office
  - The nurse will assess the student/staff in an isolation room
  - Parents will be called to pick up the student
  - The area will be cleaned and disinfected
  - The student/staff member will need to monitor symptoms and not return to school until symptom free for 24-72 hours

<p><b>Page 7: Student Responsibilities- Maintain a good attendance record.</b></p>	<p>Student Responsibilities- Attend school when healthy and no symptoms are evident.</p>
<p><b>Page 9: Citizenship- Attendance and homework completion may have an impact on the citizenship grade.</b></p>	<p>Citizenship will NOT be based on attendance. Only the following- respect, work ethic, and completion of assignments. (Perfect Attendance Awards will not be given out to students. Schools may be giving out Citizenship Awards.)</p>
<p><b>Page 10: Student Attendance- If a child is absent 10% or more of the school year, unexcused or excused, this may be a consideration for retention.</b></p>	<p>Retention will be considered on a case-by-case basis between a classroom teacher and an individual student's family.</p>
<p><b>Page 10: Truancy- The school district will issue letters regarding habitual tardiness and habitual absences.</b></p>	<p>If absences are due to an illness, letters will NOT be sent home to parents at day 5, 10 and/or 15.</p>
<p><b>Page 11: Other Dress Code Information- Hats inside the building are not permitted unless worn for a spirit day or special event.</b></p>	<p>Hats that are connected to a face shield (personal protection equipment) may be worn inside the building.</p>

# School Handbook Exemptions - Middle

20-21 Handbook	Amendments
<p><b>Page 14: Students may not wear the following that disrupts the orderly operation of the school: Hats, head coverings, including but not limited to bandannas and hairnets.</b></p>	<p>Students are allowed to wear face masks/coverings or face shields to help prevent the spread of COVID so long as they are worn appropriately and do not disrupt the operation of the school.</p>
<p><b>Page 19: Homework &amp; Absent Work – For every day a student is absent, the teachers will allow 1 day for them to make up their assignments. All work missing its deadline will be recorded as a zero.</b></p>	<p>Staff will work to support students in the event of a COVID related absence. Families and students are responsible for communicating with staff and completing work in a timely manner as agreed upon by the teacher.</p>
<p><b>Pages 19 – 20: Attendance</b></p>	<p>Parents are being asked to keep their students home when they are sick or presenting symptoms. Attendance policies will be modified to address COVID concerns.</p>
<p><b>Page 24: Citizenship Criteria 1 - Regularly attends school – No more than 8 absences per semester. (The 9<sup>th</sup> would result in a lower Citizenship grade)</b></p>	<p>This criterion will be waived for the school year. Citizenship criteria 2 on tardies will still be in effect.</p>

Page 28-29 Consequences of Excessive Absences	Omission of the consequences for excessive absences.
Page 14 Perfect Attendance	Omission of perfect attendance awards for the school year.
