

School Attendance Awareness Month

September is National School Attendance Awareness Month. We are celebrating this seventh annual campaign with the theme, We Belong in School! This is a national initiative aimed at promoting better policies and practices around school attendance.

We encourage school and district staff to remember that students are more likely to attend school if they feel safe, connected and supported, and believe they can learn and achieve. The "We" emphasizes the need all students have to feel they belong in school. It also high-

lights the role everyone, from educators to health professionals, to local agency and business partners

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can play in creating welcoming and engaging schools that encourage daily attendance.


The Houston County Board of Education emphasizes the value of regular school attendance as essential to gaining a quality education and to maximizing academic achievement. Students who miss more that 10% of the school year are academically at risk.

The Social Services Department works in conjunction with the staff and administrators of all schools to identify students and families who experience barriers to regular school attendance. They also sup-

works. regular school attendance. They also support schools with attendance awareness campaigns and recognizing students with improved attendance.



Cecond Step is research-based, teacher-informed, and Classroom-tested to promote the social-emotional development, safety, and well-being of children from Early Learning through Grade 8. Each elementary and middle school classroom in Houston County has received the Second Step curriculum through a grant with Department of Family and Children Services. Houston County School System received \$393,035.40 to support the implementation of the curriculum. In addition to the Second Step Curriculum, we received the Child Protection and the Bullying Prevention units. The Elementary Counselors will be going into each classroom 6 times during the year to share and help students recognize, report, and refuse unsafe situations. The Bullying Prevention Unit teaches students how to recognize, report, and refuse bullying. Houston County is working to support and keep our students safe with the implementation of the Second Step Curriculum.







Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is an evidence-based, data-driven framework proven to reduce disciplinary incidents, increase a school's sense of safety, increase attendance and support improved academic outcomes. Georgia has over 1,000 schools trained in PBIS and nationwide over 27,000 are schools trained in PBIS. When PBIS is implemented with fidelity, it reduces the amount of time spent on discipline, providing more time to focus on valuable instruction.

The basis of PBIS is that through consistent teaching of expectations, combined with acknowledgement or feedback of positive student behavior, undesirable behavior will decrease. PBIS schools create behavior matrices, which are a list of 3-5 behavioral expectations for the students to follow. A behavior matrix includes language such as "Be Safe", "Be Respectful", and "Be Responsible."

PBIS in Houston County is currently being implemented in 28 of our 38 schools and it is having a positive impact. The remaining 10 schools will be a part of the 2020-2021 cohort. Several schools have already had their PBIS kickoffs this year to redeliver the message of PBIS to their students and staff members.

We have been fortunate enough to have community partnerships that support PBIS. Our current community partnerships include Dress You Up Formals, Rigby's, Spillers Orthodontics, and Stevie B's. Look for the behavior matrices in these locations.
