Am I a First-Year Applicant?

The majority of Penn State's applications come from traditional, first-year students. The following types of students are considered first-year applicants (or freshman applicants, as some refer to them):

- Current high school student in his or her senior year
- Student who has earned a high school diploma or a GED and has no post-secondary coursework
- Student who has attempted 17 or fewer credits (semester hours) of college coursework at a regionally accredited college/university before attending Penn State
- Current high school student who may have enrolled in another institution(s) before graduating from high school (dual enrollment)
- Student who may have attended Penn State on a non-degree basis






