Dear parishioners,

After having had the pleasure of celebrating our patronal feast of the Archangels last weekend, we return to the regular Ordinary Time readings and the Gospel of Luke. The Gospel of Luke was, of course, strongly influenced by St. Luke's close friendship and collaboration with St. Paul, and so with a special emphasis on how to live the Christian life in terms of mentality and action. Today's Gospel seems to present us with two different messages – to place great faith in God, and to carry out God's commands without any expectation of a reward.

However, when we place these messages in the context of the other two readings, we begin to get the message. The first reading calls for God's St. Paul calls upon St. Timothy, as a bishop whom he ordained, to "stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather of power and love and self-control." While Timothy received a special gift in his ordination, all of us as Christians receive a participation in the Holy Spirit which makes us a new creation in Christ. The faith we ought to have the power of love and self-control that He has given us to do His will. Our faith requires us to persevere in God's grace by avoiding sin, but also making sure that we do the things we ought (i.e. avoiding grave sins of omission). God's grace is enough for us, but how often do we acknowledge it or believe in it? Jesus has told us, in the Gospel of John, "Without Me, you can do nothing." How often do we try to do everything on our own? If, as Jesus tells us, that we should do what we are asked and then acknowledge ourselves only as useless servants, it is because Jesus is the one who did the heavy lifting for us.

Many of the things we find hard to make ourselves do are difficult because we continue to Sioux City. hold on to our own self-centered view of what is right and wrong instead of trusting in God's. He calls upon us to change our hearts and minds to trust in Him entirely, to act according to His plan and His love, to trust in Him –

not in money, goods, pleasure, or addictive behaviors like alcohol, drugs, or gambling – to give us joy. Jesus tells us elsewhere that whomever the master finds ready when He comes, He will gird Himself and wait on them. How does this gel with what Jesus is saying in this passage? In this passage, Jesus is laying out an analogical story – we should be like servants who have to wait on their master after working in the fields all day – not to see ourselves as entitled not to do God's will right now because we feel entitled to some bears the closest resemblance to Paul's letters, reward for having done so previously, but rather to be humble about what God achieves in us. The other story promises us what will actually happen if we are ready for the master's coming. He won't tell us to wait on Him at that point, but rather bless us for our persistent faith in Him. May Jesus sustain us in doing the Father's will and in our trust in His power within us to help us be successful in doing so.

Most of our Sisters of the Leaven of the children to wait expectantly for the Lord to fulfill Immaculate Heart of Mary have headed to the His promises of salvation. Thanks to everyone who participated in interviews or filled out surveys for our feasibility study as to whether we should do a capital campaign. This coming week, we plan to have meeting with the For the Greater consulting group to find out whether or not they recommend that St. Michael Church do a capital campaign, and how if so. Please pray that God's will may be done in our parish for what He has planned here in South

NOTES FROM THE STEERING COMMITTEE #16

⁹ Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. (Galatians 6:9)

Last week, we received accountability with regard to our finances. This week, we would like to give you an accountability of what we have been doing since we were formed a little over two years ago. Much of this has been relayed previously but we thought it might be helpful to put it together.

COMMUNICATION/WELCOMING - We had to start at the beginning with letting people (including the Archdiocese) know who we are and mass times! Thanks to Mrs. Sandy Williams, principal of the school, we updated information on the Archdiocesan website as well as any other websites which give our mass times and information. We made sure that mass times were included in the bulletin and most recently, Father Mike had a sign made which is now connected to our sign out front. While the school had a website, the church was vaguely connected to it. Now, Mrs. Williams has been working since early June on a website which will feature the church more prominently as well as the school, ECEC, Religious Education, etc. There are a number of things which should be available once this website is completed. A Facebook page for the church was also started and is being excellently maintained by Patricia Mahnke. She includes both information and inspiration pieces. We also wanted some things added to the bulletin, which has been

done in the last two years. Included has been information about the various groups in the church as well as events going on in the community and whom to contact for the prayer chain among the parish news.

We wanted more communication with parishioners and the Quarterly meetings were suggested. However, we needed to wait until the Parish Center was completed. As you know, we held our first Quarterly Meeting in June of this year. In the meantime, surveys were given out in December of 2017 and again in 2018. Lists were compiled of those people who were interested in lectoring, greeting, maintenance, etc. and sent to appropriate persons. Hopefully, those interested were contacted. It was also suggested to have a Suggestion Box. Paola Velazquez 'husband (thanks Eduardo Lopez) made one for us this summer. It is in the entryway of the church along with slips on which you can write your comments/questions. Please include your name and

phone number so someone can get back to you.

We were also concerned with the appearance of our church. In July of 2018, our entryway was cleared of unnecessary objects and given a fresh coat of paint. New (donated) wall décor was placed in the entryway by Judy Clayton and Sherry Prenger. In October, the cry room and entrance into the sanctuary were painted. Speaking of the Cry Room.

Father Mike looked into what is needed to repair the heat register in there. We still need to look at the system in the entry as it is too hot in summer and cold in winter. The former baptismal room (which is now being used for storage) was curtained. (Thanks, Maria Gomez!) The Janitors's Closet was cleaned out early on and a needed fire extinguisher was obtained. Vacuum cleaners were donated.

Most recently, a new rug for the entryway was donated. There are some things that the Steering Committee has investigated but not initiated. One of those is the Decorating Committee. Pat Roberts and the ladies on her committee were able to obtain new banners and decorations for the altar and have consistently made each season look beautiful. One thing to mention is that these ladies do need some help when decorating. Please look out for appeals for help which are put in the bulletin. Lois Schock made the kneelers for the altar with donated fabric and foam. Recently, a confessional was made more private by volunteers at a minimal expense. There was another issue taken care of in order to make the church safer. Fortunately, we were able to hire Nico

Sandoval part-time to provide much needed janitorial services throughout our campus. Vinny Kramper and Darrell Schmidt took care of trying to have the bathroom supplied with toilet paper and a means to wash and dry hands which was a considerable task considering theft of toilet paper and damage to holders in the bathroom. An appeal to parents has seemed to help with this issue.

The ECEC has been inspected and is found to have some needs which have to be addressed in order for the Early Childhood Education Center to operate. The ECEC is full of children and is an important aspect of our campus. It is a very good use of our former convent as it provides excellent care for those parents wishing to have a faith based childcare. It also feeds into our school program. Larry Foster is addressing this as he has many of our maintenance issues.

The needed items will come from their budget. Vinny and Darrell have also been most instrumental in taking care of the grounds for years and took care of removing overgrown shrubs in front of the rectory and the deteriorating carpet from the porch last year. They, along with Ray Otto, work to keep the grounds mowed and free of dandelions. A metal sign which was detracting from the beauty of the outside of the church was recently removed. The man cave on the side of the school was painted by former pastor, Dan

Wittrock, again with donated paint. Shrubs and flowers on the side of the church have been maintained voluntarily by various anonymous parishioners. Most recently, Sandy Jones and Sherry Prenger initiated a landscaping design for the Parish Center. This was planted by volunteers. The LIHM Sisters and others have worked to make the landscaping around the ECEC attractive. Now, Eagle Scout, Eric Carlberg, is working on a project to make our grounds more attractive. What is now needed is funds to repair the Marian Shrine, donated by the Torticill family. We are also currently looking into having lines painted in the parking lot for the safety of students crossing to the playground as well needed lines for parking cars. There are some other things being looked into for snow and ice removal to make it safer to cross from the church to the Parish Center during winter weather. Becoming better handicapped accessible has also been looked into. Presently, those things which would be ideal are not possible financially. We are hoping that with training of greeters and ushers, they will be able to help those

who are physically handicapped enter the church. We are also addressing some needed changes to make the church safer as a whole. Unfortunately, this is a more immediate need in light of things going on in society. I will give you an update on the Safety Plan in next week's bulletin.


