Dear LHUSD Parents,

As we continue our slow and cautious approach to returning for in-person learning we want to share what steps we are taking to maintain a healthy learning environment at each school. First and foremost, we are counting on every parent to assess their child each morning. If they exhibit any symptoms of COVID19, we ask that they stay home until they are fever free for 24 hours and any other symptoms have improved. We are requiring face coverings for all staff and students, keeping groups of students together to limit exposure, practicing social distancing and frequent hand washing. Regular sanitizing is being done throughout the day with all high touch surfaces thoroughly disinfected each night. In addition, we have full time nurses in all schools to support and promote a healthy environment.

While we are taking many precautions, they do not remove the risk of exposure to COVID19. Students and staff come to school each day with other students and staff who are also at risk of community exposure. *When we become aware of a positive case, we will conduct a case investigation in collaboration with the health department, which is designed to determine who may have come into close contact (within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes) with the person who tested positive. This information will be shared with anyone who is determined to have been in close contact and needs to self-quarantine or has been in some contact and needs to self-monitor. Please see the chart below from the Student Roadmap for more detailed information.*

We have set up a COVID19 contact at the district office and each school to ensure information is gathered and communicated in a timely manner. You are welcome to contact your school or the district office COVID19 point of contact with any questions or concerns.

To be considered exposed to COVID-19, you need to have prolonged close contact with a person who has the virus. Close contact includes living in the same household,, being within 6 feet of a sick person with the virus for at least 15 continuous minutes with or without the use of a face covering, or being in direct contact with secretions from the sick person.
