### **South Carolina Performance Tasks Assessment**

Qualifying students in grades 2-5 will take the Performance Task Assessment (PTA) in March. If your child has qualified to take this assessment, you should have received a district letter and a letter from the school.

### Testing dates are below:

March 8-9 - 2nd/3rd - Face to Face students March 10-11 - 4th/5th -Face to Face students March 15-16 -2nd/3rd Grade - Virtual and Hybrid students March 17-18 - 4th/5th Grade - Virtual and Hybrid students

#### **Preparing Your Child:**

- Help your child approach the testing in a relaxed, positive way.
- Explain that the purpose of taking the Performance Tasks is to learn and use skills on several tasks.
- > Tell your child that he/she needs to listen to directions and focus on the task.
- > There are multiple acceptable responses and all responses are considered.
- Emphasize that these tasks require no special preparation.

From Our Literacy Coach...

This month our focus is on the love of reading with our Head Start, Pre-K, and Kindergarten students. Read early and read often. The **early years** are critical to developing a lifelong love of reading. It's never too early to begin reading to your child!

The tips below offer some fun ways you can help your child become a happy and confident reader. Try a new tip each week. See what works best for your child. No matter what the age, spending time with your child(ren) enjoying reading will give great benefits!

- Read together every day. Read to your child every day. Make this a warm and loving time when the two of you can cuddle close.
- Give everything a name. Build your child's vocabulary by talking about interesting words and objects. For example, "Look at that airplane! Those are the wings on the plane. Why do you think they are called wings?"
- Point out **print everywhere**. Talk about the written words you see in the world around you. Ask your child to find a new word on each outing.
