Class Dojo

Please sign up for class dojo. There is a free app or you may sign up through email. A code was given at Open House. If you need an additional copy of the code, please let your child's homeroom teacher know. We will use Class Dojo to track points for each student and to communicate with parents. Students will need to maintain at least 80% positive Dojo points each week in order to participate in our "Fun Friday" activities. Students' behavior will determine whether they lose points for negative behaviors. Each parent should have received a paper explaining the positive and negative behaviors.

Lexile Levels

Please be familiar with your child's Lexile Level, a measure that is a valuable tool for teachers, parents, and students. It serves two unique functions: it is the measure of how difficult a text is and it is a measure of a student's reading ability level. Your child will be tracking their Lexile scores throughout the 2020-2021 school year.

Students should have a Lexile Score of 920 by the end of their 5th grade year.

- * Connect to Class Dojo to track your child's classroom behavior and communication with teachers.
