

### What is CROP?

CROP is an after school program that gives time and support for homework. This does not mean all homework will be completed. It will also give students hands on experiences through crafts, projects, cooking, dance, music, etc. on topics they are learning about in school. CROP is partnered with the Hanford Mills Museum and the Farmers Museum which will provide distance learning sessions, on site workshops as well as fieldtrips.

### When does CROP start?

CROP will begin on Wednesday, October 16, 2013.

### What days and times will CROP be held?

CROP will be held Monday through Friday. (adjustments may be made depending on attendance and participation) The times will be from 2:45(dismissal) until 5:00 p.m.

### How much does CROP cost?

CROP is a federally funded program that is free to students that meet the criteria.

### How is it determined who can attend CROP?

There are federal guidelines some of which involve completing a free/reduces lunch form and application. There is also a Parent Orientation meeting that parent(s) are required to attend.

### When does the application need to be turned in?

Return the application to school no later than October 4<sup>th</sup>.

### Will there be transportation?

Yes, W.A.J. will provide 4 p.m. transportation via the late bus. For students participating until 5 p.m. it will be the parent's responsibility to transport.

### Will there be snack?

There will be time allotted for snack. We encourage parents to send a late day snack with the child.

### What are the attendance requirements?

Students must attend CROP at least three days per week.

### Is there CROP over vacations?

CROP does not operate over vacations, conference days, half-days, snow days or if there are emergency school closings.
