### HCCA Engineering Students Learn How to Use Woodworking Equipment Safely

In William Smith's engineering courses at the Houston County Career Academy, students are learning how to use woodworking equipment safely and effectively. At the beginning of the school year, students are taught general laboratory safety and how to use woodworking equipment in his classroom. The students learn how to use the drill press, band saw, and miter saw through teacher led step-by-step demonstrations and student practice.

By learning how to use the drill press, band saw, and miter saw, students are able to create catapults, structures, and other various woodworking projects by using the engineering design process. The engineering design process, which is similar to the scientific method, is a step-by-step process that engineers use to design and create processes and creations.

Hands-on projects, such as catapults being constructed in engineering courses, provides students the opportunity to use their creativity, designing skills, and teamwork and communication skills, which are essential and highly sought after in the engineering industry.
