Dear Parent and Guardians,

This letter is to inform you that we were notified yesterday that an additional staff member at our Elementary/ Middle School has tested positive for COVID-19. Immediately following notification, we contacted the Pennsylvania Department of Health. Through contact tracing, we have concluded that only intermittent contact occurred with the infected individual and those who were involved have already been notified.

Due to this being the second positive case within the last week in our Elementary/ Middle School, students in grades Pre-K-8 will learn remotely on Friday November 13, 2020. Students will follow their Virtual Academy schedule as they did during the first four weeks of school. Students in grades 9-12 will follow their normal face-to-face schedule on Friday November 13, 2020. As a reminder, parent/teacher conferences are scheduled for Thursday November 12, 2020. Students in grades Pre-K-12 will not physically attend school and will instead log into their google classrooms and learn asynchronously on this day completing assignments that are posted by their respective teachers.

COVID-19 is a disease that is capable of rapidly spreading person-to-person. People infected are capable of exposing others to COVID-19 even if their symptoms are mild, such as a cough, or even if they are asymptomatic. Additionally, exposure is possible by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching one's mouth, nose, or eyes. Symptoms of COVID-19 may include fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, repeated shaking, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, diarrhea, nausea/vomiting, and new loss of taste or smell. Older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions are at a higher risk for serious illness.

Parents are reminded to self-screen your children prior to sending them to school. If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 as stated above, it is extremely important that you do not send your child to school and contact your local health care provider.

The Frazier School District is concerned about the health and well-being of you, your family and the general public during this outbreak. We understand that this is a difficult time, and that some individuals may need additional support during this period.
