Bulletin column December 15, 2019 "From the Pastor"

Dear parishioners,

This will be one of the shortest bulletin columns I have done since coming to St. Michael's as pastor. I am suffering from a bad case of the flu which has delayed the writing process and reduced my ambition to say very much. I pray for anyone else who is or has suffered from this flu this year — it's not much fun. I offer my sufferings for all those in our parish who are dealing with cancer, whether in diagnosis, treatment, or recuperation.

This weekend brings us the Third Sunday of Advent, which is known as "Gaudete" Sunday. Gaudete means rejoice, and our candle and vestment color is rose, a combination of Advent violet and Christmas white which symbolizes being over halfway through Advent to Christmas. Our readings call us to this spirit of rejoicing. We may sometimes in our earthly lives not see much to rejoice about. God, however, invites us to rejoice in His merciful love for us and the promise of eternal life, both brought to us so powerfully in the self-giving love of Christ. I found it to be quite an exceptional faith experience a couple of months ago to visit parishioner Emelia Raya while she was in hospice care for cancer. Emelia suffered physically a great deal in this time, but more often than not faced her challenges and her impending departure from the world with serenity, peace, acceptance, and a quiet joy. I had a sense during my visits to her of treading on the holy ground of a tremendous faith and the Spirit of Christ powerfully at work.

The peace and joy of Christ come from His emptying Himself to become one of us in His incarnation and giving Himself in suffering and dying on the cross. His gift is not cheaply given, and it is not cheaply experienced. It is the generosity and joy of love, which is God, Himself. The love, joy, and peace of Jesus' kingdom is the greatest treasure we can receive in this life. May this Advent and Christmas season inspire us to receive and always seek to hang onto and live out of that precious treasure all of our life long.

I want to thank all of those who made our Our Lady of Guadalupe day liturgies and devotions so special this past week, and invite all parishioners to participate in our Guadalupe festival this Sunday. Our Lady brought the mercy and love of God's kingdom to the people of Mexico; may she also inspire us to bring that goodness to our neighbors around us, especially those who

are suffering or in need.

For the past two and a half years, I have been very pleased to have Fr. Michael Keating here in the parish as my associate. As a former pastor, Fr. Mike has been very proactive to see needs in the parish and to address them. He has, honestly, made it possible for me to survive as a first-time pastor in the 8th-largest parish (in terms of Mass attendance) in the Archdiocese of Omaha. Moreover, he loves the parish and hopes to stay here for a long while. That reality has always been held in tension with the awareness that St. Michael's, being 85% Latino and about 50% Spanish-exclusive, very much needs for both of her priests to be able to serve in Spanish as well as English. Because I hope to have Fr. Mike remain with us for the next few years instead of having to depart due to parish needs, we have worked out for him to study Spanish for 12 weeks in Guatemala beginning this January. His departure date has not been officially signed off on, so I plan to announce that next week. We also have a priest lined up to fill in for Fr. Mike during that absence, but that, too, is not yet 100% official, so I will likely announce who it is next week. Suffice it to say that he is not a native Spanish speaker, but has been learning how to serve in Spanish and is quite a bit more advanced in this process than Fr. Mike.

One result of Fr. Mike's absence and the presence of this fill-in priest is that I plan to alternate weekend schedules with the substitute, which will allow me to have quite a bit more time with the English-speaking community. I know that there's a bit of culture shock when I do the English Masses, but hopefully we'll get to be used to and appreciate each other! I am hoping that this balance can continue when Fr. Mike returns. It all depends on how vociferously he applies himself to those Spanish studies! Let's all wish him success, as we appreciate him and hope that he gets to stay with us for a long time to come.

Story on the appearance of the Blessed <u>Mother to Juan Diego</u>

Juan Diego was born in 1474 in an area that is now part of Mexico City, Mexico. His indigenous name was Cuauhtlatoatzin, which means "talking eagle." Juan was most likely from a peasant family and worked as a weaver, farmer, and laborer. When Franciscan missionaries arrived in the area in 1524, Juan and his wife, Maria, were among the first to be baptized, even though Juan was already 50 years old by that time.

On December 9, 1531, Juan woke up before dawn to begin the 15-mile walk to attend daily Mass at the Franciscan mission, as he usually did. As he passed Tepeyac Hill, Juan heard music and a voice calling him in his native language. Curious and excited, Juan climbed the hill and saw there a radiant lady, Mary, whose clothes were shining and glimmering. She asked Juan to go to the bishop and tell him that she wished for a shrine to be built on that site.

Juan did as he was told, but the bishop was skeptical and asked for time to think about it. On his way home, Juan saw the Lady once again and suggested that she might do better to pick someone else because he was "a man of no importance." The Lady insisted that she wanted Juan's particular help, and the next day Juan returned to the bishop to repeat her request.

The bishop asked for a sign to prove that the vision was authentic, and Juan returned to the hill and told the Lady, who responded that she would provide one the next day. On December 11, Juan's uncle fell sick, and Juan was busy at home caring for him. Juan's wife, Maria, had died two years earlier, and his uncle was his dearest and closest relative. The next day, his uncle's condition worsened and

the distraught Juan Diego left to find a priest to hear his uncle's confession to prepare him for death. Juan was embarrassed that he had not fulfilled the Lady's wishes, so he took a different route around Tepeyac to avoid seeing her, but Mary appeared to him on his detour and gently reprimanded him for not turning to her—

"Am I not here? I, who am your mother?" she said.

The Lady assured Juan that his uncle was healthy, that she was watching over him. She instructed Juan to climb Tepeyac once again and collect the roses he saw in bloom at the top of the hill. Juan obeyed and picked from the unusual, out-of-season abundance of beautiful roses he found. Juan took the roses to the Lady in his tilma, that is, his cloak, and she rearranged them

before sending him to the bishop.

When Juan arrived at the bishop's palace, he opened up his tilma, to show him the amazing sign of the roses in winter. But, when Juan opened up his tilma and the flowers tumbled out, an image of the Lady appeared, painted in vibrant colors on his tilma. The bishop knelt before the image, in awe, recognizing the Lady as an image of Mary, the Mother of God. Immediately, the bishop began to enact Mary's request to build a shrine on Tepeyac.

Juan was granted permission to live the rest of his life as a hermit in a small hut attached to the church built on Tepeyac, and he spent his days in prayer and service to the pilgrims who came to the shrine. Juan died in 1548 and was canonized in 2002 by Pope John Paul II.
