

Student Discipline Update

HPE:

Comparative Data of Referrals through the past few years:

2017-2018: 207 Referrals Total; 77 Major, 130 Minor

2018-2019: 324 Referrals Total; 92 Major, 232 Minor

2019-2020: 463 Referrals Total, 237 Major, 226 Minor

RJSHS:

Overall discipline is down in regards to referrals being submitted by teachers. Property damage and littering is on the rise. Students are engaging in campus clean up (once a month) during advisory to help teach students pride in their school. Incidents of nicotine vaping is down but marijuana possession is up from last year and with younger students. Students attending assigned detentions is very good due to consistent parent contact and student reminders the days of detention. We have increased the consequence for skipping detention and the results have been excellent. Classroom disruptions are still a problem at the middle school level. Very little discipline comes from 10th through 12th grade.

NCA:

The mix of Jr High and High School students in the drop in center is creating a large amount of disrespect between students who are trying to work on completing tasks versus those who are off task.
