The Makings of an MLC Borscht Supper

350 lbs potatoes 125 lbs carrots 20 lbs peppers 270 lbs beef 9 cans beef base

300 lbs cabbage 125 lbs onions 90 cans tomato juice 20 lbs butter 100 loaves of bread

40 lbs ice 1 gallon vinegar 10 lbs water 24 quarts half & half 720 cups of coffee 110 pies


