

Dear Falcon Family,

Happy holidays! This is a wonderful time of year, but also very busy and so can be stressful. As the adults begin preparing for the excitement of the holidays, children can also feel the stress and exhaustion brought on by this busyness. Please continue to support your child in his/her school success by making sure your child has a quiet area and a consistent time to read and complete their homework. Also ensuring a bed time is maintained at a reasonable hour. Adequate sleep supports learning, brain development, concentration, and mood and so directly affects children's success at school!

Colder weather also sometimes means more illnesses at school. As a reminder, any medication that you send to school must be brought by an adult to our Med-Tech, Mrs. Sommer Bostick. If the medication is prescription medication, it must be accompanied by the physician's written orders on how it is to be dispensed. We cannot dispense any medication that is not accompanied with a doctor's orders. Even cough drops must be sent to the school Med-Tech and can only be administered to a child by the Med-Tech. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us ensure the safety of our students!






NES Celebrates Veterans Day
