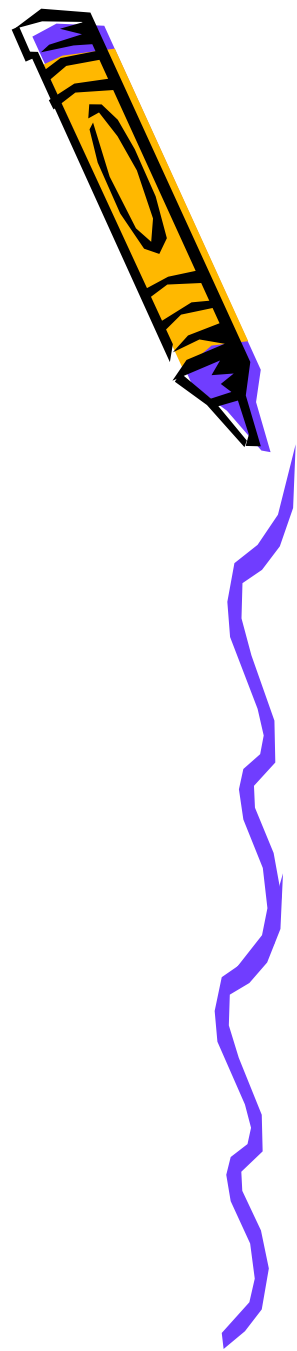

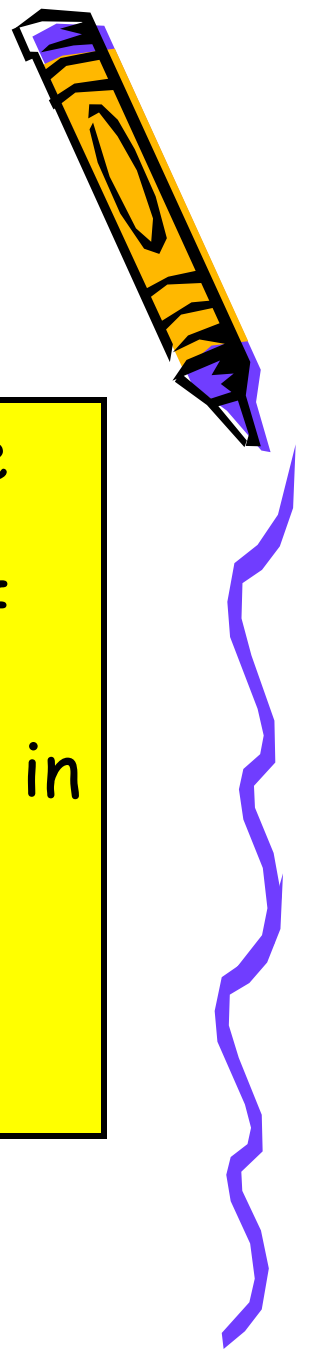

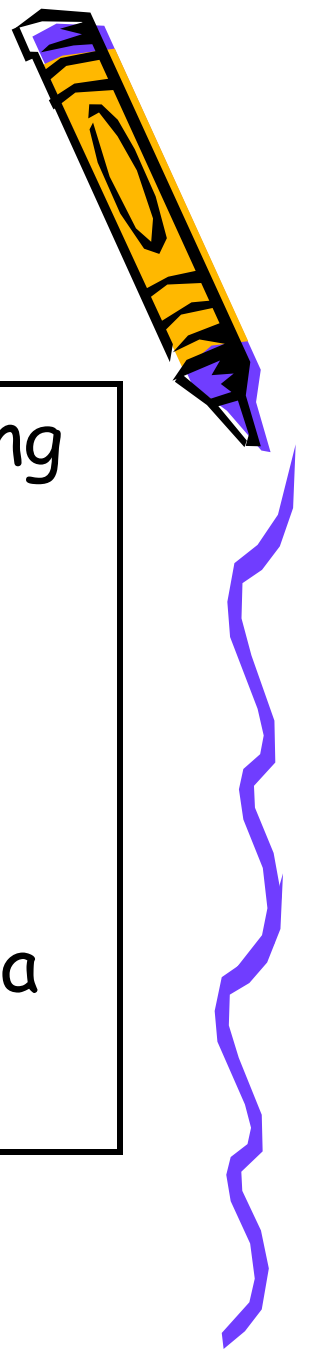
What is Title I?



- Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for every child.
- The program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year. Hardee Junior High is a Title I schools.



How Title I Works



- The federal government provides funding to states each year for Title I.
- The Florida Department of Education sends the money to the district.
- The school district identifies eligible schools and provides Title I funds.
- **Hardee Junior High School** implements a **schoolwide** program.



Title I funds

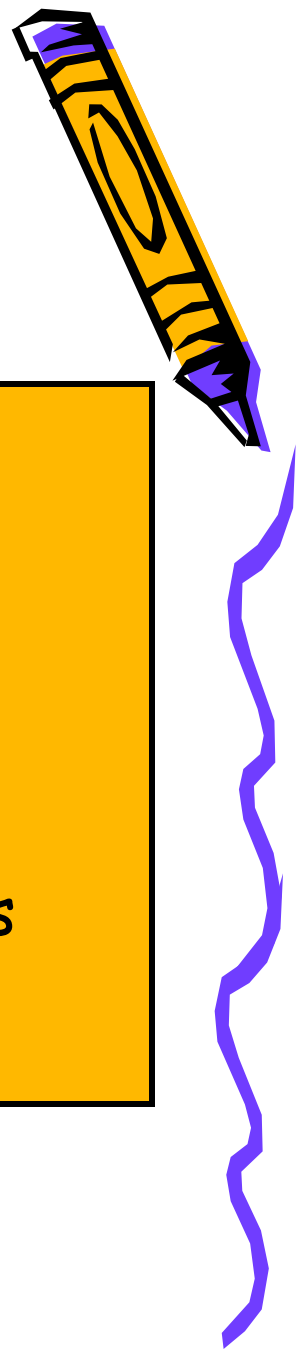


- Hardee Junior High School is provided to pay for services and programs for our students.
- Title I funds pay for the following:
 - Resource Teacher
 - Literacy Coach
 - Paraprofessional
 - Technology
 - Supplemental Materials
 - Computer Programs
 - After School Program
 - Parent Involvement Activities



Title I Programs Provide Supplemental Support

- Smaller classes;
- Additional teachers and paraprofessionals;
- Additional training for school staff;
- Extra time for instruction (Before and/or after school programs);
- Parental Involvement Activities; and/or
- A variety of supplemental teaching methods and materials.

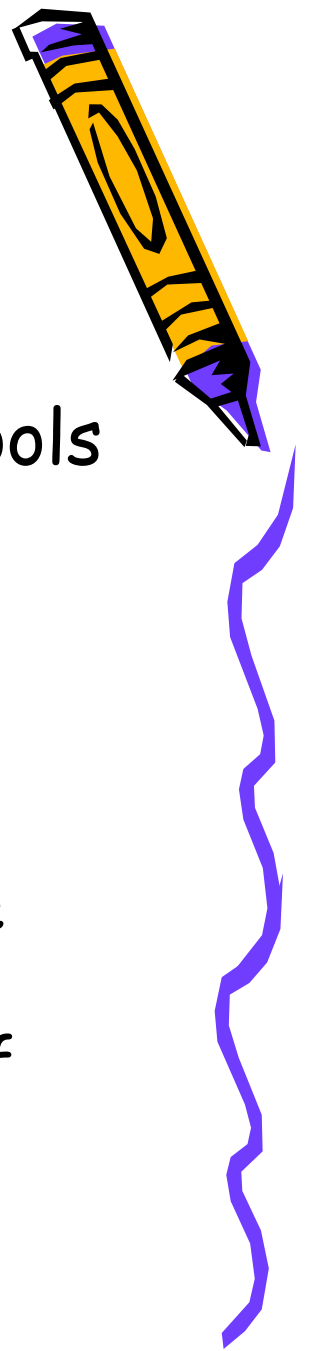


Who decides how funds are used?

- Every school has a School Advisory Council (SAC) composed of:
 - Parents, Teachers, Other staff that works at the school, Principal and Students
(at Elementary, Middle and High School)
- The School Advisory Council determines how to use Title I funds and Parent Involvement funds.



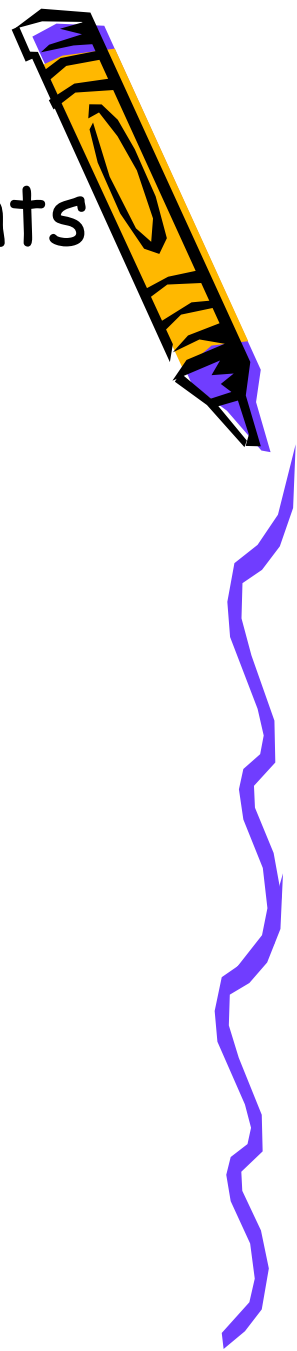
Working together!



- Title I law requires that all Title I schools and families work together.
- How we work together is listed in our:
 - School Level Parental Involvement Policy;
 - Parent-School Compact; and
 - HJH's Title I Plan which is also know as the (School Improvement Plan). The School Improvement Plan (SIP) and components of the SIP direct the focus of HJH.

- Assists parents in understanding academic content standards, assessments, and how to monitor and improve the achievement of their children.

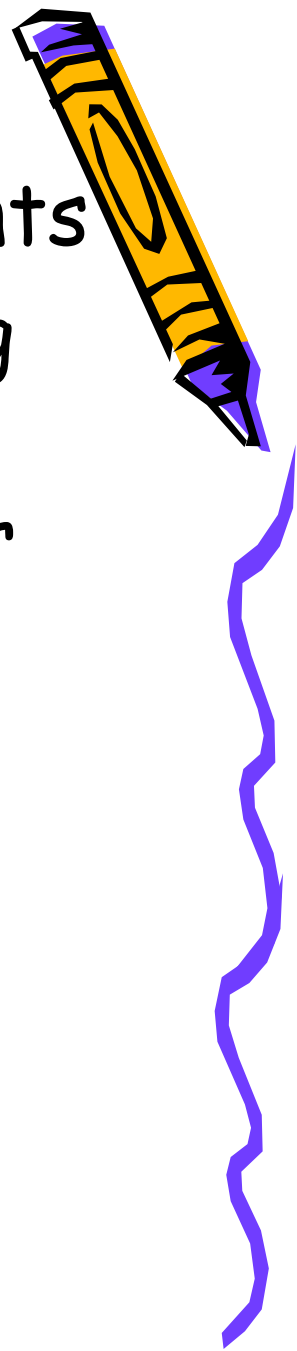

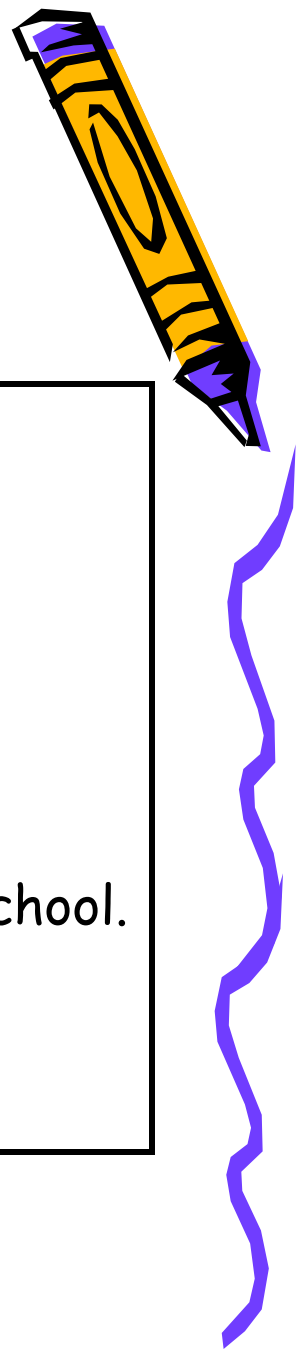
Parent's Rights



- Be involved and request regular meetings to expression your opinions and concerns;
- Be provided information on your child's level of achievement on assessments like FSA in reading/language arts, mathematics, and science;
- Request and receive information on the qualifications of your child's teacher; and
- Be informed if your child is taught by a non-highly qualified teacher for four or more consecutive weeks.



Your involvement is Key to your child's success!



- You are your child's first teacher.
- You have the ability to influence your child's education more than any teacher or school.
- You know your child best:
 - Share information about your child's interests and abilities with teachers; and
 - Ask to see progress reports on your child and the school.
