

## Call Out for October 9, 2020

This is Richard Dennis, Superintendent of Elmore County Public Schools. As we end the first nine-week grading period and the state student enrollment count, Elmore County Schools student enrollment has reached 11,279; this is an increase of 88 students over last year's enrollment count.

Over the last week, 17 students reported testing positive for COVID-19 and 4 employees.

Today is the last day of the first nine weeks grading period and all virtual assignments must be completed by 3:00 P.M. today. Student report cards will be distributed on October 22. A schedule for report card distribution will be communicated and posted on each school's website for school-based virtual students.

As we end the first term, parents please, be reminded that students will have until October 26 to change their learning platform from virtual to traditional face-to-face school. The next available opportunity to make the transition will be at the end of first semester in December. Parents of a school-based virtual students please note that if your student does not participate and meet virtual engagement requirements, the administration at your student's school will be in contact to provide the available options for the next grading term. These options include an "Incomplete" for the term grade and return to traditional face-to-face school or withdrawal from the school if the student fails to meet participation guidelines.
