## Dear FCSS Community:

I would like to thank you for a great start to the 2018-2019 school year. I am thankful for our community, especially our people – both children and adults. I am continually impressed with how our students are always the focus of this caring community. Along this line, it has come to my attention that a troubling new trend has developed recently in the northern part of our state, including here in Fannin County. I received a call earlier today from District Attorney B. Alison Sosebee. She reported that several students in nearby counties are using electronic cigarettes and requiring medical attention. The devices are known as "vapes" or "juuls," and students are inhaling a variety of substances with them. This issue has occurred in our own county, and one substance known as "kronic" is being sold locally; it has resulted in students experiencing serious reactions. Some of these students have required emergency medical attention and subsequent transport to a hospital.

The Fannin County School System is working to educate students about the dangers of "vaping" and the use of other controlled substances. We will do this in an age-appropriate manner and in conjunction with community resources, including District Attorney Sosebee and Sheriff Dane Kirby. We ask you to please help us at home; if you have not already done so, please talk to your child(ren) about the seriousness of vaping, in all forms and with any substances, and also about the dangers of using any other controlled substances. These activities are not allowed at school and will be treated with disciplinary action. More importantly, though, your child's safety is at risk. Vaping devices come in a variety of forms and can look like USB flash drives, lighters, pens, and other common items. The school district has posted pictures of various devices to watch for on our Facebook page (Fannin County School System).
