



Parent and Family Engagement Plan 2020-2021 School Year

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What is Title I?

C. B. Watson Primary School (CBWPS) is identified as a Title I school as a part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement plan.

School Plan for Shared Student Success

What is it? The C. B. Watson Primary School's Parent and Family Engagement Plan describes how our school will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. CBWPS values the contributions and engagement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes how parents and families can partner with CBWPS and help develop and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised? All families are invited to attend our annual Shared Decision Making Meeting held each spring. Families are asked to review and give feedback on Title I documents (Engagement Plan, Schoolwide Plan, Compact, and budget including the 1% set aside). Parents and families unable to attend are welcome to have copies of materials sent home for review CBWPS welcomes input on the plan at any time during the year. Our post-event surveys are reviewed to help improve activities. The annual Title I Parent and Family Satisfaction Survey allows parents to give feedback on the year's events, required notifications, communication and budget. All feedback is taken into consideration when planning for the next school year. Unsatisfactory comments regarding the Schoolwide Plan are reported to the district.

Who is it for? This plan is for all students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. CBWPS will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, of migratory children.

Where is it available? The Parent and Family Engagement Plan is included in the Title I Handbook that is given to all parents and families during new student orientation at the beginning of their placement at CBWPS. The plan is also available on the school website and in the Parent Resource office. Parents can request a copy be sent home to them at any time during the school year.

2020-2021 District Goals

Increase percentage of students mastering math standards at grade level by 5% by May 2021.

School-Parent Compacts

Part of the CBWPS Parent and Family Engagement Plan is our School-Parent Compact. The compact is a document that explains what teachers, parents and students each will do in effort to work together to make sure that our students successfully meet state, district and school goals. This compact will be reviewed and revised each year based on input from parents, students and teachers. Our Pledge to our Parents and Families

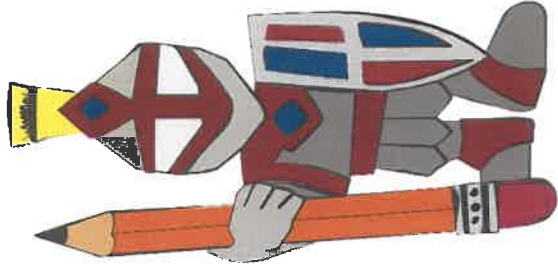
