
Salem Family Success Center Raises Awareness For Child Abuse Prevention Month With Family Fun Day The Salem Family Success Center held a "family fun day" on Wednesday, April 21 in honor of Child Abuse Prevention. About 10 vendors participated and 30 families were served during the event. The Salem City Police Chief and Chief Detective of Salem County Prosecutors office made an appearance with a few other detectives, and Salem City Councilman Tim Gregory was a vendor for his group "The Huddle."

Overall, SFSC was very pleased with the turnout of the event. Every participant had their temperature checked at the door and was asked to use hand sanitizer before entering. Masks were required, and all vendor tables were set up six feet apart per CDC guidelines. All vendors had incentives for our clients who visited their tables. Games and prizes were available for the children, and each parent who registered with SFSC received a gift card from Wawa or Walmart.
