

IN THE SPOTLIGHT





Family Resource Youth Services Center Dawson Springs Independent School District

Sponsors may shop for a student or donors can contribute money for staff and volunteers to shop for a student. To become a volunteer call the center, the program this year will be different because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Many volunteer shoppers may choose to sit out this year or order their choices online. Others may shop in the stores following COVID-19 protocols including hand-washing, social-distancing and mask-wearing.

Typically, sponsors spend \$125 or more on a student; however, any donation or assortment of gifts is accepted.

our child may qualify for free or low-cost health insurance through the Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP).

KCHIP is for children younger than 19 years old whose family meets certain income guidelines. Families who qualify are usually in the middle to low income range.

Children enrolled in KCHIP are covered for:

- doctors' visits
- hospital stays and emergency services
- mental health services
- lab tests and X-rays
- prescription drugs
- immunizations
- speech therapy
- health screenings
- dental, hearing and eye checkups

Applying is easy. A face-to-face interview is not required. To apply for KCHIP:

- request an application by phone by calling toll-free (877) KCHIP-18
- print a mail-in application online at kidshealth.ky.gov
- apply in person at your local Community Based Services office

For help filling out your application, call toll-free (877) KCHIP-18 (877-524-4718).
