Centerville Elementary School Is a Title I School

- **What does that mean?**
 - **It means that we receive additional federal funding to provide a quality education for all of our students.**
 - **Schools in Houston County that have approximately 50% or more of their students receiving free and reduced lunch typically are Title I schools. This year, approximately 80% of our students are eligible for this program, however we receive a grant allowing all students to receive free breakfast and lunch.**
 - **This funding helps school offer improved programs such as support staff, instructional & technology resources, activities and workshops for families, and professional development for teachers.**

Title I Funding for 2020-2021

- To decide on the best way to budget our Title I funds we do a needs assessment by looking at our annual parent surveys, using the shared decision making process, and by looking at student achievement data.
- Examples of what we fund include:
- Instructional Materials and supplies for Students (books, manipulatives, computer programs, educational games)
- Salary for additional staff including an Intervention Teacher and a Family Engagement Coordinator
- Professional Resources and Learning Opportunities for Staff
- Substitutes for Teacher Planning Days
- Materials for the Parent Resource Center

School-wide Goals

- Increase the % of students reading on or above the grade appropriate Lexile level range as measured by the GMAS and/or HCLI.
- Increase the % of students in grades 3-5 falling in the Distinguished Learner level range as measured by the GMAS.
- Decrease the % of SWD falling in the Beginning Learner level range as measured by the GMAS.

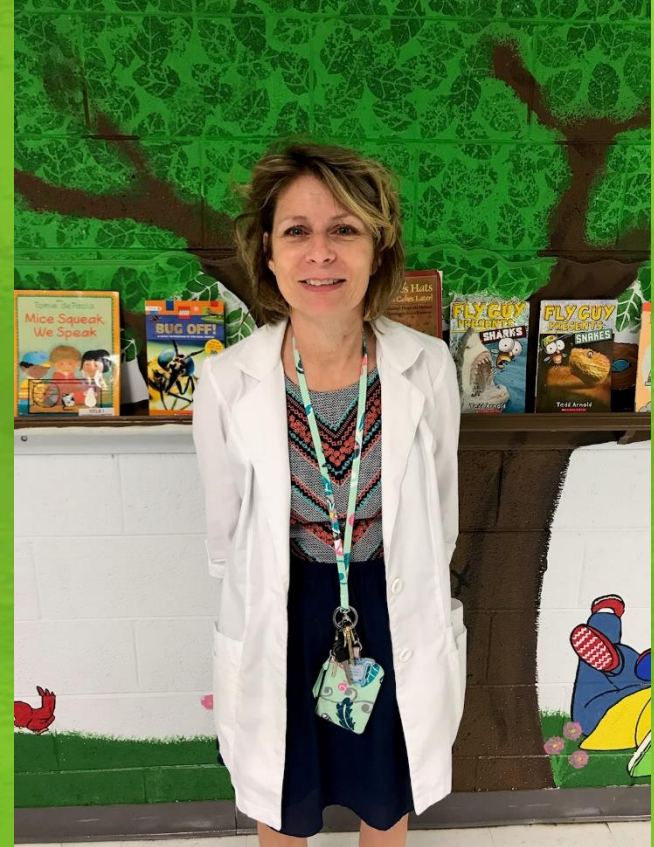
