All board members present voted aye to accept the October 25, 2011 regular meeting minutes. Motion passed.

**Superintendent's Report**

Mr. Bernardi read his report.

1. **Parent Conferences and Report Card Distribution** was held throughout the District on **Thursday, November 10, 2011** from **12:00 Noon to 7:00 P.M.** I am happy to report the following percentages of parent participation throughout the District:

2. Wyoming Area High School competed in the **2011-2012 WVIA-TV 6<sup>th</sup> annual Scholastic Scrimmage** during the week of **October 24<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>** and won the **2011 LIU 18 Championship**. The team consists of **Daive Fanelli, Greg Cajka, Leslie Shumlas, Gared Zaboski and Audrey Hiedacavage**. The win qualifies the team for the Pennsylvania Academic Competition in Harrisburg on Friday, May 4, 2012. The team also won \$1,000.00. Congratulations to **Team Members and Moderators, Eileen Palmer and Jessica Werbin, Academic Teams Coaches**.
3. Wyoming Area Middle School competed in the **16<sup>th</sup> Annual Young Scholars Program at Scranton Preparatory School** on November 5<sup>th</sup>. Approximately 75 top students from 19 schools competed in a **"quiz bowl"** covering topics from art, geography, languages, literature, math, music, science, social studies as well as current events and popular culture. Wyoming Area defeated St. Jude's and Good Shepherd in the final round to win our **fifth** championship in **7** years. 6. UPDATES:

*Montgomery Avenue  
State Vouchers*

Mr. Bernardi reported that the documents and necessary paperwork has been filed for reimbursement from FEMA due to the flooding at Montgomery Avenue. Mr. Bernardi stated Mr. Amico and Sam Scarantino of Quad Three are awaiting approval from FEMA. The damage has been documented in excess of \$600,000.00.

Mr. Bernardi reported that the state vouchers did pass by the Senate and now it is in the House. One hundred percent of state subsidies for students lower income students in the lower 5% of school districts in the state. So, what they are doing is taking money from public education and giving it to students for private and parochial schools. It's now in the House and this is a \$930,000,000 cut for education. This will mean larger class sizes and cuts in extra-curricular activities and some of our staff. Mr. Bernardi stated this is painful for education and he has contacted Phyllis Mundy and will call all legislatures.

7. *I want to take this opportunity to present Plaques to Outgoing Board Members, **Dave Alberigi** (4 years of service), **Sam Aritz**, (4 years of service), **Nicholas DeAngelo** (8 years of service) and **Toni Valenti** (20 years of service) in recognition of their years of outstanding dedication to Wyoming Area School District and in appreciation of the diligent manner with which they carried out their duties as Officers of the Board. At this time, Mr. Bernardi presented plaques to four of our outgoing board members, Mr. Aritz and Mr. Alberigi with four years of service, Mr. DeAngelo, eight years of service and Mrs. Valenti, with twenty years of service. Mr. Bernardi stated "Mrs. Valenti was first sworn in as a board member on December 3, 1991 and some of you weren't even born." "She has been a true friend over the years along with Sam Aritz who is a personal friend of mine, Dave Buttons Alberigi, who was a friend long ago and Nick DeAngelo who I didn't know who also came to be a good friend of mine." Mr. Bernardi stated they are outstanding individuals and he handed each board member a plaque.

Motion by Mr. Casarella, second by Mr. Aritz to accept the finance report.

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ON the question: Dr. Campenni questioned item #7 and item#10. Mr. Melone responded they are programs we outsource to the Luzerne Intermediate Unit. These services are billed annually to the district and are usually billed at a per hour rate.

Dr. Campenni asked the status of the roof project. Mr. Bernardi responded the roof at the Secondary Center is 94% complete and we owe them \$100,000.00 for some final things to be done. Dr. Casarella asked if the roof leaked with all the rain we had. Mr. Amico responded a couple little spots. John Pegg of West Wyoming, questioned item #2. Mr. Melone responded that the LIU has adjusted their billing format. The new monthly bill includes charges for traditional special education services (at a base rate of \$75,000.00), Alternative education services (at a monthly estimate \$10, 150.00) and Lighthouse Academy charges (at a monthly estimate of \$2,250.00). In summary two programs are being billed monthly to the district rather than at the end of the year.

Mr. Pegg questioned item #5. Mr. Melone responded the balance dues will differ prior years for special education services since the district pays monthly amounts based on estimates for the year. At year end, the estimated census is reconciled to actual services and the balance due for credit is determined.

Mr. Pegg asked if the denial for Montgomery Avenue School is from October. Mr. Bernardi responded yes. FEMA would reimburse the difference after all insurance proceeds are exhausted.

George Race of Exeter asked Mr. Bernardi regarding FEMA reimbursement, "You didn't plan on getting 100 percent?" Mr. Bernardi responded FEMA would pick up 75%. Mr. Race asked if the pension bond came up when Mr. Bernardi spoke to Phyllis Mundy. Mr. Bernardi responded it didn't come up. Mr. Race asked Mr. Bernardi to explain what the partial hospitalization plan on page 8. Mr. Bernardi responded that is for students with behavioral problems.

Mr. Race questioned item #12. Why is it in finance. Mr. Bernardi responded it is a settlement agreement for a special education student. Attorney Hassey responded we can disclose the cost. Mr. Bernardi responded it can start at \$20,000.00.

Roll call: All board members present at the meeting voted yes to accept the finance report. Motion passed.

Mr. Aritz read the building report.

On the Question: Dr. Casarella stated he was not in favor of item #3, \$13,000.00. When Mr. Yorina did this, he did it during school hours.

Cindy Borzell of Wyoming questioned in the case SJD was closed would Mr. Bugelholl keep the \$13,000.00. Mr. Bernardi responded no. Mr. Race's questions pertained to the building report. Mr. Race questioned the incentive payment for item #1, Tom Pepe. Mr. Melone responded \$13,238.16. Mr. Race stated item #2, it states wastewater and drinking water testing, where item #3 stated wastewater only. Does that matter. Mr. Bernardi responded yes, it does matter. The Department of Environmental Protection stated he can be in the position. Mr. Bugelholl is currently being certified to get his

drinking water license. Mr. Race asked when he is certified will he get \$21,000.00. Mr. Bernardi responded no. Mr. Race questioned item #6. Is that an incentive on top of the regular incentive. Mr. Bernardi responded the support staff did not. This is a temporary incentive from the spring. The board approved this, but when Mr. Bernardi checked the records it wasn't in the minutes. Bob Borzell of Wyoming questioned item #3 under building. Mr. Bernardi responded Mr. Bugelholl has his license for waste water. Mr. Borzell asked when he will be licensed for the drinking water. Mr. Bernardi responded that the problem with that is because of state cut backs, they only have the test once a year, so the next test will be in April at State College. Mr. Borzell asked if that was the same test he took for the waste water because when he checked there was only a couple hundred people for renewal license. Mr. Bernardi responded Mr. Bugelholl took the test last year. Tom Cason of West Pittston asked is there an insurance policy for liability to be obtained (regarding item #3 under building). Mr. Bernardi responded he is licensed for Wastewater Management and Mr. Bernardi stated he would have to find out. Mr. Bernardi stated he is doing Carl Yorina's job. Mr. Cason asked what happens if he gets injured after hours. Mr. Cason asked if he is covered under workers comp. Mr. Bernardi responded he is an employee of the district, so yes. Mr. Cason asked if this is going to be done after hours. Mr. Bernardi responded yes. Attorney Harry Skene asked if this position was posted. Mr. Bernardi responded yes, five or six months ago.

Roll call: Dr. Campenni, Dr. Casarella and Mrs. Valenti abstained on item #3 and voted yes on the remaining report. All remaining board members voted yes on the entire report. Motion passed.

#### Open Discussion:

Dr. Campenni commented that she was not against item #3 under activities, the conference, but is concerned about how we're spending money. Mrs. Valenti stated it was a honor and a pleasure to be on the board for twenty years, she really enjoyed it, and thanked Mr. Bernardi for all his help. He was always there when she needed him. She stated they go back thirty years and she enjoyed working with him. Mrs. Valenti also thanked Attorney Hassey and Mr. Melone for always returning her phone calls and answering questions she had. To the administrators and employees of Wyoming Area, Mrs. Valenti thanked them and hoped they would continue to keep Wyoming Area going in the direction it's going. Mrs. Valenti thanked the taxpayers and community who came to the meetings with their input. Mr. DeAngelo stated he would like to repeat what Mrs. Valenti said with the administrators and faculty, the support staff, Attorney Hassey, Mr. Bernardi and Mr. Melone and stated you are only good as the people underneath you are. These are paid people to do their jobs here. Mr. DeAngelo thanked supporters who supported Toni and himself and stated it is an honor to be a part of the board of the district he graduated from. To the new board members and members who are still here, this is not rocket science, it is common sense and asked them to remember any decision made will affect taxpayers and the 1,300 children here. It will affect their education and well being, so use common sense and use common sense that way. Mr. Alberigi stated it was an honor to be a member of the school board and when he walked the halls years ago he never thought he would be on the school board. On his travels, in Scranton, Carbondale or Hazleton, people always say what a great school district Wyoming Area is. Mr. Alberigi stated it is a great school district from administrators, teachers, students, custodians, secretaries and police department, it is these people that make Wyoming Area a success of what it is today. Mr. Alberigi stated it is an honor to play a small part in it.

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Mr. Alberigi welcomed the new board members and also thanked his family, who were present, for the endless phone calls and for what they went through.

Neil Kolcheski of West Pittston, stated he graduated from Wyoming Area thirty years ago and asked if Mrs. Fedor or someone could come up with the proper transcripts to verify a grade that he had gotten. Attorney Hassey asked him to talk with Mrs. Ranieli, Assistant Secondary Building Principal.

Rebecca Pierce from falls spoke in support of her husband, Tim, that applied as a volunteer for wrestling but was denied. Mrs. Pierce stated her husband has a past just like many who were at the meeting that night. She stated many people can change, her husband is living proof of that. Mrs. Pierce stated her husband had the support from the coaches and the kids. All he wants to do is volunteer his time for the kids. Mr. Bernardi informed Mrs. Pierce that he would contact Mr. Parra and will discuss it with Attorney Hassey. Mrs. Pierce stated they just want to know why he was denied. Mr. Bernardi responded they would get back to her. Mr. Dominick stated he wasn't aware of it.

John Pegg of West Wyoming asked if it would be possible to add more material to the web site for contracts such as, but not limited to: transportation, support staff, teachers and superintendent. This would help to prevent misconceptions. Mr. Pegg asked when they will have a budget meeting. Mr. Bernardi responded after the reorganization meeting. At the first meeting in December, Mr. Bernardi will discuss with the board to have a budget meeting. Mr. Pegg asked if the flood days will be made up. Mr. Bernardi responded they are still waiting for an answer. Mr. Pegg asked if the work sessions and regular meeting agendas can be listed on the web site. Mr. Pegg questioned the analysis of monitoring district fund balance. Mr. Melone responded the district is moving towards rolling out various financial information to the board and public.

With no further questions, the meeting was adjourned at 8:12 p.m. on a motion by Mr. Alberigi.
