FAITH FORMATION for K4 through 12 began on September 16. Twenty-two students attended the first evening. There are others who missed the date or were deterred by weather. All students must have a registration form including an email address. Registration fee is \$25. Classes meet every other Wednesday but will have an assignment each week that we do not meet. Entry to building on class nights will be through the upper gym level at 6:15pm for sign in and wellness review. (TEACHERS arrive at 6:15 also) Masks are to be worn unless seated in classroom. No water fountains are available and restroom breaks will not be scheduled, so please take care of those before coming to class. Dismissal is 7:30 pm through the same upper level gym access. If weather is bad, we will bring the younger students to the car line, otherwise, parents picking up may wait out on the sidewalk maintaining safe distancing. Pray for students, teachers and parents as we continue the walk of faith despite a few inconveniences along the way.

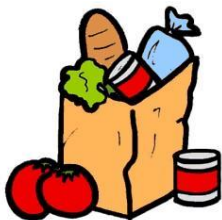
