Dear Parent and Guardians,

This letter is to inform you that we were notified yesterday evening of positive COVID-19 case within our high school. The individuals who were considered close contacts have been notified and will be required to quarantine. The Pennsylvania Department of Health has been notified and we will follow any and all recommendations that they provide.

Currently, we have one positive case at the high school within our 14-day rolling period. If the district reaches two positive cases within the 14-day rolling period in any one building, then we would be required to move to a remote instructional delivery model for 3-5 days for that building. However, if we are able to disinfect the contaminated areas, as well as identify those considered to be "close contacts" of the positive case, we can return to face-to-face instruction after one day of mitigation.

COVID-19 is a disease that is capable of rapidly spreading person-to-person. People infected are capable of exposing others to COVID-19 even if their symptoms are mild, such as a cough, or even if they are asymptomatic. Additionally, exposure is possible by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching one's mouth, nose, or eyes. Symptoms of COVID-19 may include fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, repeated shaking, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, diarrhea, nausea/vomiting, and new loss of taste or smell. Older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions are at a higher risk for serious illness.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 as stated above, it is extremely important that you do not send your child to school and contact your local health care provider.

The Frazier School District is concerned about the health and well-being of you, your family and the general public during this pandemic. We understand that this is a difficult time, and that some individuals may need additional support during this period.
