

Congratulations to our outstanding Fine Arts students. We love watching your talent grow.














Dear Parents and Guardians:

On February 17<sup>th</sup>, Calhoun R-VIII School Board voted to adopt the 4-day calendar for the 2020-21 school year for our Elementary and HS buildings only. The Early Childhood Center will remain on a 5-day calendar because of the requirements from Head Start. These decisions are never easy, but after careful consideration and the growing trends in our state and area, we felt we should move in that direction as well. During the 2019-20 school year the state moved to an hour requirement only and no longer has a day requirement for school attendance, so in our adopted calendar for 2020-21 school year, we have 1091 student hours and the state requires 1044 hours. In the 2019-20 school year, we have 1095 student hours, so as you can see, we are real close to same number of student hours with the new 4-day calendar. We will attend school primarily Tuesday through Friday, with one Monday a month designated a teacher professional development day allowing our staff to work on improving in a variety of instructional areas for our students.

Beginning in the 2020-21 school year, there will be over 90 school districts that will be operating on a 4-day school week across the state. There are many considerations for making this move, but one in particular is being able to retain teachers in our district and being able to attract teachers to our district when we have openings. Many smaller districts lose teachers to larger districts for pay reasons, but operating on a 4-day calendar allows us to offer something they do not. There will be some financial savings for the district, but that is not the primary reason, but something that will definitely be a benefit overall. To accomplish the new 4-day calendar the student day will be increased by 45 minutes. Currently we attend from 8:00AM – 3:00PM and our new day for 2020-21 will be from 7:45AM – 3:30PM.


Being off consistently on Monday's will allow staff and families to schedule appointments that in years past they have had to miss school to accomplish. Studies show that a 4-day week will increase our staff and student attendance and by having better attendance from both teachers and students, it can only improve the learning that goes on daily. Monday's are the day we chose to take off because many of the already scheduled days off for Holidays are on Monday's.

I am also sending home the adopted 4-day calendar for 2020-21 school year. I know we are still a long ways away from the beginning of next year, but this will allow you to look at and plan for the new school year.
