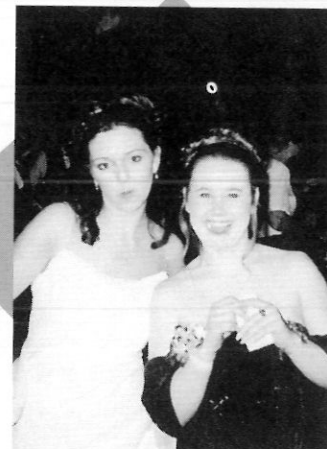


Here's to the Night

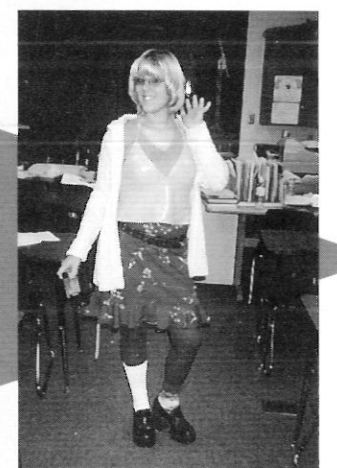
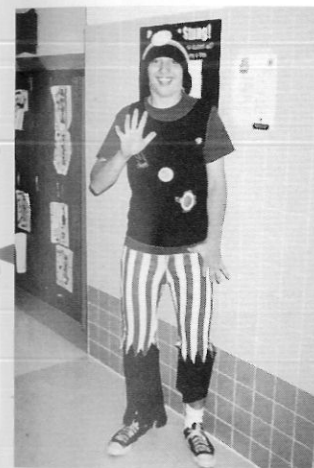
Homecoming 2002

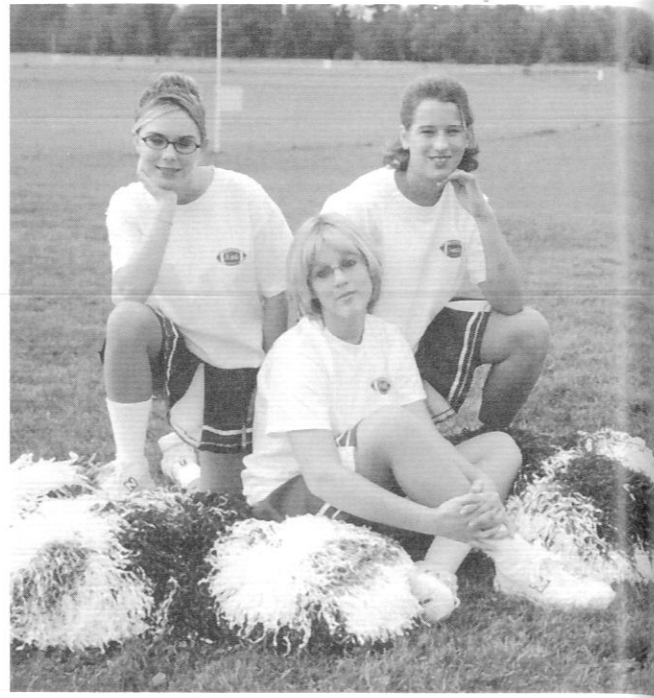
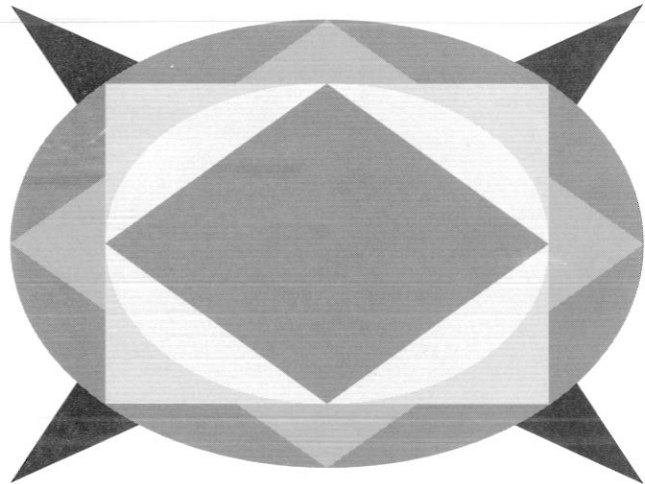
Uphill All the Way
