Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2019-20 educational progress for the Shelby High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact the high school office for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following web site: [SHS 2019-20 Annual Education Report](#), or you may review a copy in the main office at your child's school.

For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Shelby High School has not been given one of these labels.

Based on the Fall 2020 SAT results retrieved using the College Board, 36% of all students at the state level were proficient in mathematics while 17% of Shelby High School juniors were proficient. The key challenge for Shelby High School is that students are performing below average state proficiency in the area of mathematics.

Shelby High School continues to work hard to ensure that we provide a safe environment to engage, encourage, and prepare all students to think critically and excel at lifelong learning. There are several key initiatives in our school to ensure that we achieve our mission.

- ELL and migrant support services for qualifying students
- Highly qualified teachers provide instruction in at-risk courses which are designed to prepare them for MMC mathematics
  - Summer school opportunities for students who are at risk of not achieving MMC.

3. Shelby High School school students may choose to take CTE courses through Newaygo County Career Technical Center or West Shore Tech Center during their 11th and 12th grade years. All students have the ability to dual enroll at a variety of institutions throughout the state.

4. Parents have the ability to review curricular content upon request. Students receive a syllabus for each class outlining expectations, curricular content, and contact information for the teacher should a parent wish to receive more information about the course.

5. Shelby High School juniors earned an average SAT ERBW score of 462 and an average SAT math score of 448. These scores reflect that students took the SAT in the Fall of 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic delaying testing from the Spring of 2020.

6. During the fall 2019 parent teacher conferences, the parent participation rate was 30%. Those parents who did not attend in person were contacted by the teacher.

•After school and summer programming for students through a 21st Century grant (ASPIRE)

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. Shelby High School is the traditional high school in the district for 9th,10th, 11th, and 12th grade students. Students are not assigned to our building, but are free to enroll as residents of our district.

7. Shelby High School would also like to present the following information:

A. In 2019-2020, 24 students participated in dual enrollment (6% of eligible 11th and 12th grade students).

B. Shelby High School students are able to take AP Computer Science and AP Biology. In 2019-20, 16 students (4% of eligible students) enrolled in AP Computer Science and 18 students (4.5% of eligible students) enrolled in AP Biology.

C. Eleven students received an AP test score leading to college credit
