Best Case Scenario Starting on July 27th we will track new and active cases. Before the first day of school, IF we see a steady decline or low static number of new cases in Jefferson County we will start in Phase 2.

Alternate Scenario Starting on July 27th we will track new and active cases. Before the first day of school, IF there is an increase or spikes in number of new cases, the School Board will determine what Phase we start school in, and reassess after 16 days.

Timeline for First Semester

Date	Action
2-Aug	Start monitoring data and entering it into the graph daily to show whether we have a gradual increase or decrease over the month.

10-Aug	Share results of preliminary data with the board and make a decision on what Phase to enter school.
11-Aug	Notify parents and families about the board decision on what Phase we will enter school and what that will look like. Let them make a final remote election. Call families that you have not heard from.
2-Sep	First day of school
2-Sep	Meet at the end of the day with each staff cohort and discuss where procedures can improve. Adjust as needed.
23-Sep	16 day monitoring benchmark
20-Oct	16 day monitoring benchmark
30-Oct	End of Quarter 1 - reevaluate what Phase BES is in
	Continue monitoring every 16 days
22-Jan	End of Semester 1
22-Jan	Reevaluate
Considerations	If no rise in cases consider starting in Phase 2 with a 1:15 ratio staying in Pods
	Consider having no kids on playground before school starts to limit interaction
Benchmarks	Benchmarks need to be laid out - complete by 8/24/20
	Consider a benchmark to go to longer days
	Consider having students in-person working on their remote online school work - start with IEP, 504, intensive
	Consider a benchmark to hold in-person PE
	Consider a benchmark to hold in-person band students daily
Gauges of when to go to Phase 0	When we reach 1% of Jefferson County's population with an active case: 11,778 = 118 Active Cases
	Governor directs school closure
	A staff member that travels to each cohort/pod tests positive for COVID-19 - Whole School 14 Day Shut Down
	A staff member that works in the kitchen tests positive for COVID-19 - Whole School 14 Day Shut Down
	A member of a pod tests positive for COVID-19 - Whole School 2 - 5 Day Shut Down, the positive pod will go to Phase 0 for 14 days, the other pods return after 2 -5 day deep cleaning and contact tracing
	Absences reach 20% (example 120 students = 24 students) could be tracked per class or pod, certified staff absences reach 27% (4) =we will go remote (or remote for those classes, potential online learning in the classroom overseen by the subs), or there are no subs available
	Hospitals are becoming overwhelmed
