

Promotion Requirements



All Bok Academy (& PCSB) students must meet the below criteria to be promoted to the next grade level for the following year. Please contact Leanne Thrift @ 638-1010 for further information.

Students of all grade levels MUST meet ONE of the following:

A student must have a cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average) with all course work (including all Academics & Keystones) of 2.0 or higher. This GPA is figured by first assigning each letter a point value: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0. For each course the 1st and 2nd 9 weeks grade point values are averaged to generate the 1st Semester Grade point value. The same happens with the 3rd and 4th 9 weeks grade point values to generate the 2nd Semester grade point value. Then, the 1st and 2nd Semester grade point values are added together. If your student is enrolled in 6 courses, the total number is divided by 12. If your student is enrolled in 7 courses, the total number is divided by 14. This result is the GPA.

--OR--

A student must have a cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average) with only academic course work of 2.0 or higher. The four academic courses are Math, Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies. Semester points are calculated the same as above. The total number is then divided by 8. This result is the GPA.

--OR--

*6th & 7th- A student must have an Achievement Level of 3 or higher on the FCAT SSS Reading and Math.

*8th- A student must have an Achievement Level of 3 or higher on the FCAT SSS Reading and Math AND an Achievement Level of 3.5 or higher on the FCAT Writes+.

-----AND-----

A student must pass the following four subject areas with a minimum of 2 quality points throughout the year, which is determined by the 9 weeks letter grades (A-4pts; B-3pts; C-2pts; D-1pts; F-0pts):

- Math
- Language Arts
- Social Studies
- Science

7th Grade ONLY:

A 7th Grader (In 2014) MUST pass Civics, which includes an End of Course Exam counting towards 30% of their overall final grade.

8th Grade ONLY:

An 8th Grader must complete both College & Career Prep with the Professional School Counselor as part of their US History/ Careers course.

Bok Probationary Status:

Any student falling below a 2.25 GPA and/or having attendance concerns will be placed on Probationary Status, consequently, jeopardizing his/her continued enrollment at Bok Academy. The staff of Bok Academy will support each and every child, but ultimately the student must put forth the efforts toward improvement.
