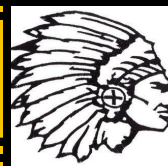

Anne-Claire Taylor



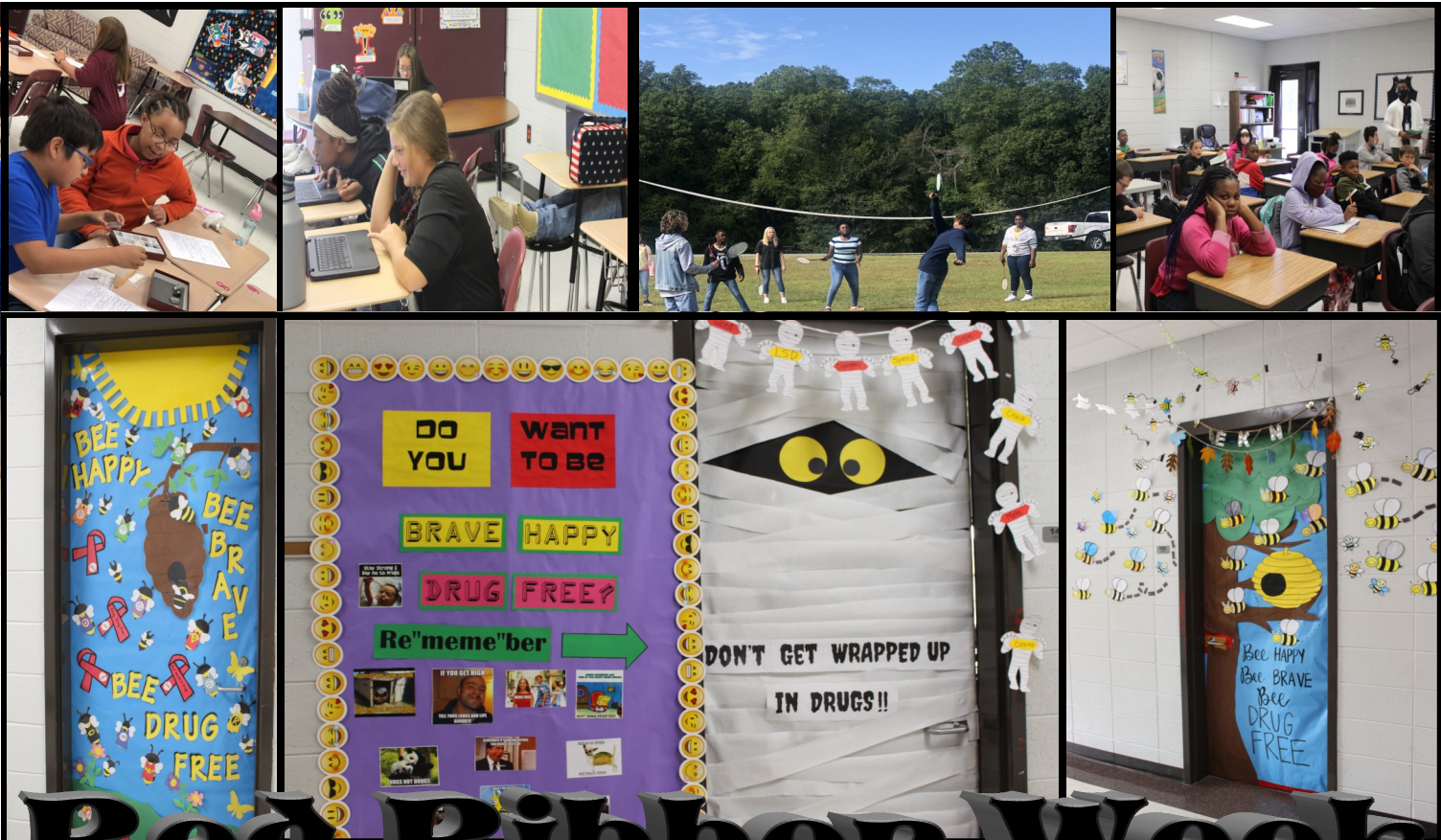

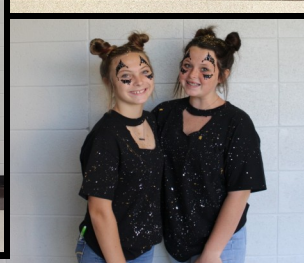

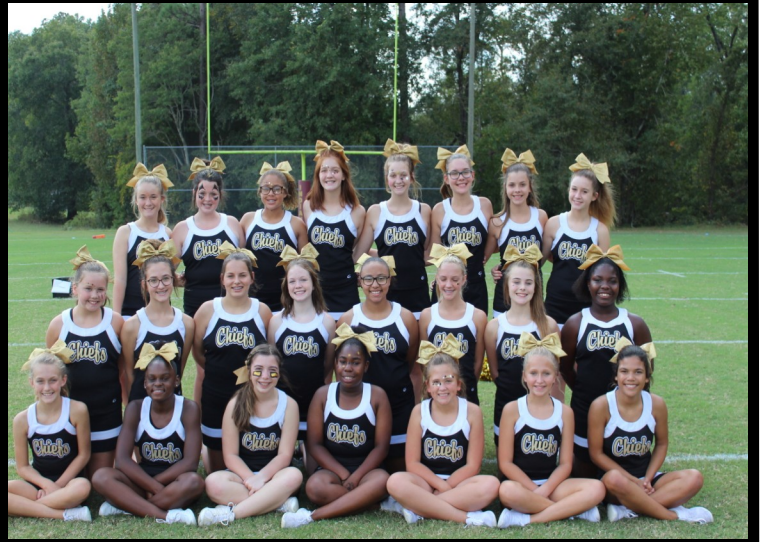
