Mark Plencner is Making a Difference in the Fight Against Cancer

A 1976 graduate of Warren High School, Mark Plencner had a definite plan of what he wanted to do with his life entering the real world. Being a fine athlete for the Ponies, he knew how to formulate a game plan. Following that game plan led him on a career path culminating as the Pharmacy Supervisor at the Roger Maris Cancer Center in Fargo, North Dakota, a position he has held since 1996. Before we learn of his duties there, a trip down memory lane will help inform you how he proceeded to achieve his goals.

He has many fond recollections of his years as a student/athlete at WHS as well as some interesting and amusing anecdotes about several of his favorite former teachers and administrators. He stated, "Chemistry, Physics and Math were classes I enjoyed which played a great role in my career choice. One of my favorite and most entertaining teachers was O.J. Peyton whose profound teaching moment always involved the "Rule of the Left Pinky." As I recall, it was his way of emphasizing an important point coupled with a hint that we might see it on a science exam. I must say I really

enjoyed the team of teachers and coaches at WHS. Each had their own style and flair. Teachers like Bob Mattson, Dennis Anderson and Bill Porter along with O.J. were like a band of brothers standing at the intersection of the hallways that converged just outside the chemistry classroom. They were hall monitors disguised as greeters. As I look back, I wonder if they were assessing what kind of game face they needed to bring to the classroom that day. During my time, Rick Schmiedeberg was a newcomer to Warren and was the first to introduce computer technology and hand calculators to the classroom. Guidance counselor Percy Gilbert helped me map out my career path which I followed to a "T". Superintendent Mel Hanson and then principal Jerry Dalzell were excellent administrators. They possessed a wonderful talent of being a friend to the students and faculty, but also knew when to draw a line in the sand. Athletic Director and Football Coach

Howard Emerson did so much for all the sporting events. He was always able to keep the facilities, uniforms and equipment in great condition. Of special note, he always led the team in prayer prior to hitting the field for the game. What a simple, but kind, gesture seeking safety for the kids he coached. As for my grade school days, I very much enjoyed the teaching skills of Mildred Stroble, Marilyn Bennett, Louis Daniels and Ken Peterson. These were all very important and influential educators to me, but my biggest nod goes to Gary Schuler, who early on, recognized something in me and helped me identify the rewards for hard work."

Mark was a three-sport athlete for the Ponies. His senior year, he led WHS to their first district basketball championship since 1962. He commented, "My favorite extra-curricular activities

were anything that involved a ball, a hoop, a glove, a club or a racquet. Basketball was my overwhelming favorite and the one that I put the most time into. Coach Schuler laid out his vision and our class of '76 bought heavily into that vision and the results proved to be my fondest memories of WHS. I was fortunate to be a part of an awesome and talented class of young men and women.

Following his high school graduation, it was time to put his plan into action with a bit of an adjustment to start with. He explained, "I was always impressed by local pharmacists Ken Kroll, Phil Kotts and Chuck Steffan. As a youngster, the white coats and high counters caught my eye. However, I really caught fire to become a pharmacist during a career class day presentation. My presentation was on a career in aviation which I thought would be fun. My classmate, Steve Goodwin, presented a very compelling story on becoming a pharmacist and I was impressed. Later I met with Percy Gilbert and asked what I needed to do to get it done. I first went to Mavville State College for three and a half years. This was part of the plan set up by Mr. Gilbert to allow me to pursue my dream of playing college basketball at a school that had a pre-pharmacy curriculum. From there I went to North Dakota State University and obtained a Bachelor of Science Degree in Pharmacy in 1983."

After he received his degree, it didn't take long before he was gainfully employed. His first job was as a staff pharmacist at Dakota Hospital in Fargo. After 3 years, he was promoted to Assistant Director of Pharmacy which was a position he held for 10 years. His progression continued when he left that position in 1996 to pursue an opportunity to work at a Meritcare retail pharmacy. After only 3 (Continued on page 6)

(Continued from page 1) months there, he was asked to serve in a management role at the Roger Maris Cancer Center. He has been with Roger Maris for 21 years.

His job description requires many important responsibilities at the Center. Asked to explain, he replied, "First and foremost, I lead a team of 7 pharmacists, 9 pharmacy technicians, 3 interns and a patient assistance specialist, each with important duties involved with screening, preparation and administration of over \$50 million annually of intravenous and oral chemotherapy and support medications. IV medications, most of which are considered hazardous substances due to the nature of their actions on human cells, are produced in a specialized clean room with filtered air 10,000 times cleaner than room air. Our integrated pharmacy management program utilizes barcode scanners and cameras to record all steps in the production of IV medications. The safety and accuracy is remarkable. We are actively involved in clinical research, always investigating ways to improve responses to specific cancers. I am also very committed, both locally and nationally, to patients with bleeding disorders having served as board chair for the Hemophilia Alliance and helped build the first and only not-for-profit national buying group for medication used to treat Hemophilia and other bleeding disorders.

"The most gratifying part of my job during the past two decades

I have served here, is the fact our management team has been given great latitude to develop programs and services necessary to provide outstanding care and services to our patients. With that, I've had the great and humbling honor to serve a number of people from Warren and the surrounding area. I do not take this opportunity lightly. It's also been a pleasure for me to serve as a Preceptor for NDSU pharmacy students and I have taught institutional pharmacy practice and pharmacology to students at NDSU College of Pharmacy in Wahpeton, ND.

Mark gives a lot of credence to his progression of success to his upbringing in a small community like Warren. He said, "I give so much credit to my family, friends, the community of Warren and to the school system for helping a shy guy flourish. I feel Warren was a fantastic place to grow up. To me it was "Camelot" with a few challenges sprinkled in. Smaller communities like Warren and now Warren-Alvarado-Oslo typically have smaller schools and smaller student bodies. Each student has equal opportunities to participate in any or all of the arts, athletics and other programs offered, unlike larger schools. Larger schools may be more diversified in what they offer, but the participation funnel quickly narrows by Senior High. The odds of cultivating multiple interests favor small schools in my opinion.'

Mark's immediate family begins with his wife, Stacy (Toupin)

who graduated from WHS in 1977. They have two married sons. Josh (Jessica) who is an assistant teaching professor at Drexel University in Philadelphia, PA, and Joe (Katy) who is a math teacher and assistant track coach in Honolulu, HI. Mark and Stacy plan on going to Hawaii in October for the birth of their first grandchild.

A loyal contributor to the WAO Education Foundation, he closes by saying "One of the great joys of summer is returning to the WAO Ed. Foundation golf scramble. The community and Foundation board deserves a shout out for making this event happen.
