DeAnna Carlson Zink Leaves The Farm And Becomes UND Alumni CEO

This is the story of the fascinating life of a northwest Minnesota country girl raised on a dairy and grain farm in the Angus area who has become the chief executive officer for the University of North Dakota Alumni Association and Foundation. In between, DeAnna Carlson Zink (Warren High School 1982), shares a very interesting account of what led up to her achieving that prestigious position at UND and what it involves.

It all starts with her family. She is married to Wayne Zink and they have five children and five grandchildren. Her parents are Mylo and Marlene (Bonnette, WHS 1958) Carlson who still live on the family farm. Her siblings are Michael Carlson (WHS 1985); Darren Carlson (WHS 1995) and Kimberly Molacek (WHS 1990), who is married to Garrett (WHS 1989).

When asked about some favorite memories of her school days at Warren, she replied, "It is hard to pick out only a memory or two or even a favorite teacher. I feel very lucky to have attended the Warren schools. I loved the science and math classes in particular - the teachers made these topics engaging and interesting. I also felt so lucky to be able to compete in athletics and participate in many choral and band activities. I think my background from Warren High School helped me immensely in developing my leadership skills, speaking skills and my ability to converse

on a variety of topics.' She was also involved in many church activities as well as 4-H during her school years. She participated in 4-H leadership activities and demonstration speeches, which she felt greatly expanded her confidence in public speaking. Leadership in her local 4-H club extended to the regional and state level, which led to her participating in an exchange program. She stated, "I spent a summer in Japan as an exchange student. This experience definitely changed my life. Prior to going to Japan, I had been on an airplane only once to Minneapolis. My mother was the one who 'pushed' me towards this experience. I learned some Japanese through books and cassette tapes. This

exchange program was such a learning experience for me. I learned to think on my feet, to have conversations with people who don't speak the same language and learned what it was like to be a minority. We 4-H students spent a few days in Tokyo getting acclimated and learned about the families with whom we would be staying. During our acclimation time, I was told Japanese citizens would not believe my hair was real (it was very long and blonde at the time). In fact, during my train ride to Okayama, I was gawked at considerably and some people came up and touched my hair. That was quite an experience for a farm girl from Angus, MN!'

Following her high school graduation, DeAnna began her college education at Concordia College. After one year, she transferred to the University of North Dakota, majoring in Business Management and Communications. She graduated with honors in 1986 and was fully prepared to become gainfully employed.

She immediately began employment with the UND Alumni Association and Foundation in 1986 and worked there until 1998. During those 12 years, she held a variety of positions including special events, annual giving, major gift fundraising and campaign fundraising. She was involved in the management of each position as she moved up in the organization. In 1998, she moved on as a regional vice-president of marketing for Bremer Bank. She worked with the 14 banks in her region and also spent time at the St. Paul corporate office about every two months.

In 2001, DeAnna was recruited back to the UND Alumni Association and Foundation. She explains, "I was hired to start an Alumni Relations and Marketing Department. At that point, the organization did not have a graphics or marketing department, so we started the department at that time. In 2003, I was asked to move back into fundraising and start a fundraising department like I had done for alumni relations. I spent the next few years revamping the fundraising arm of the organization and then oversaw the first major all-campus campaign for the organization as the chief development officer. In 2014, I became the chief executive officer for the organization."

officer for the organization." As CEO for the UND Alumni Association and Foundation, DeAnna oversees all engagement and fundraising activities for the University. There are 45 full-time employees who raise on average, \$35-40 million per year for the University. There is a volunteer board of 22 individuals who are alumni from across the country and she reports to them. She states, "Our organization focuses on how we get our 120,000 alumni and friends involved and engaged with their alma mater. I work with our University partners every day to find ways to raise more money for them and to uncover new donors. My favorite part of the job is visiting with alumni and hearing their stories and being able to reminisce with them about UND. We have very passionate alumni who truly love this University, just like I do. Connecting alumni to our University and to our students today is definitely the best part of my job." Like most people who live in Grand Forks, she has faced

Like most people who live in Grand Forks, she has faced adversity, namely the disastrous great flood of 1997, which forced her family from their home. Although it was not wanted under these circumstances, three of her children had the opportunity to attend the same public school their mother went to. Reflecting back on that she said, "Kinzey, Karissa and Kody and I moved in with my parents at the farm and the kids actually stayed through the (Continued on page 5) Ed. 


