The New Milford High School Band knows how to keep busy! In addition to playing at home football games and providing the music for the All School Musical, the band and color guard also performed in several USBands competitions. With their show entitled "Heartbeat with Music" by Key Poulan, the band ended the season finishing 4th in the USBands Class 5 Open New England States Championships held at Kennedy Stadium in Bridgeport, CT.

Additionally, both the NMHS Band and Color Guard groups competed in USBands and MAC, Musical Arts Conference, indoor competitions. The Winter Guard was MAC Scholastic A State Champions for the second year in a row! Winter Percussion finished 2nd at the USBands Indoor Championships held at the Sun Bank Arena in New Jersey.

Many of the music students also participate in events hosted by CMEA, Connecticut Music Educators Association. The students prepared the audition material on their own and were selected to many different honor groups throughout the year.

In April, the Wind Ensemble, Concert Band, Jazz Band and Winter Guard traveled to Virginia Beach, VA to perform in the Festivals of Music Competition. The Jazz Band finished second in their class with a rating of Excellent. The Concert Band finished first in their class with a rating of Excellent. The Winter Guard finished first in their class with a rating of Superior. The Wind Ensemble finished first in their class with a rating of Superior. The Wind Ensemble was also awarded the William D. Revelli Concert Band Award for the highest overall score at the competition.






