

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

### Monitoring Requirement Not Met for Red Rock Day School Water System – PWS ID#NN0432007

Our water system violated drinking water requirements over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct these situations.

*\*We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During Calendar Year 2020 we did not monitor or test for contaminants and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time. \**

Samples were not collected due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminants we did not properly test for during the last year, how often we are supposed to sample for these contaminants, how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples will be taken.

Contaminant	Required Sampling frequency	Number of samples taken	When samples should have been then	When samples will be taken
Total Trihalomethanes (TTHMs)	1 sample every year	0	2020	As soon as possible
Five Haloacetic Acids (HAA5)	1 sample every year	0	2020	As soon as possible

#### What is being done?

A confirmation sample will be collected within the month of September 2021. Branch of Environmental Management (BEM) will work with the contracted laboratory for sampling supplies. The water operator will collect the samples as soon as possible (ASAP) and deliver the sample to Hall Environmental Laboratory Analytical in Albuquerque, NM. Once the analytical data are received BEM will report the results to Navajo Nation Environmental Protection agency, Public Water System Supervision Program and Red Rock Day School.
