Dear parishioners,

This weekend’s Gospel contains one of Jesus’ most confusing and obscure parables. He speaks of a steward who is going to be fired by his master for having wasted the master’s wealth. The steward worries greatly about the future because he either can’t or won’t do honest work – how is he going to survive? He goes to each of those who owe debts to his master, and reduces the amounts of their promissory notes. He gives up the portion of their debts which would have been his “take” in order to make friends with them. The debts he collected would have run out, but hopefully their goodwill won’t.

What does this have to do with the Christian life? Jesus indicates that the dishonest steward, with his wise worldly choice, is wiser than His followers often are. Jesus advises that we “make friends with dishonest wealth,” and gives a strong indication of what He is talking about with His final comment: “You cannot serve both God and Mammon (money).” The one we should ingratiate with our use of money is God. Instead of pursuing wealth for our own enjoyment and benefit, we should be using plenty of whatever money we have in excess of our survival needs in generosity to the poor and to the Church, building up treasure in heaven.

There is a clear contrast between what Jesus teaches and what American society calls us to. In the United States, we are considered good citizens within our economic system to the extent that we spend, spend, spend on things we don’t really need. There’s a sense that if people don’t do this, the economy will collapse. Essentially, if we aren’t greedy and materialistic, we’re hurting the country and the well-being and livelihood of those around us.

Jesus calls us to keep our priorities straight. Observant Catholics are an increasingly small proportion of the U.S. population. There are plenty of folks around us who are propping up the economy by piling up things they don’t need. However, many of the charitable organizations around us find themselves pinched in serving people in need. And we are well-aware of the needs of St. Michael Church of our support right now with our capital campaign. Jesus invites us to set our hearts on the things of heaven and not of earth, to focus our energies, and our economic decisions, on what is necessary for our salvation.

How ascetic do we need to be? Personal economic adviser Dave Ramsay suggests that the best standard is 1) giving the first 10% of our gross income to our Church and to the poor, 2) then not living above our means, and 3) that the best indication of whether we’re living within our means is whether or not we have debt on anything other than the house we live in. If we do, then it’s time for us to tighten our belts big-time, beginning with selling some of the things we don’t need to get out of debt, and to put a certain amount of money away in savings once we achieve that. This will result in our having a lower standard of living than the people around us who make the same amount of money. However, if our way of life pleases God, who cares what others think?

We received a recent comment in our suggestion box expressing dismay at our capital campaign, criticizing our plans to add staff by clearing away the parish center debt. The person was concerned that we “were doing just fine” before without all of that staff, and recommended that we simply just stay the course of paying off the parish center slowly in five years, leaving any other projects until then. He or she also felt it was a waste of money to hire an outside consulting company for the campaign and have them get our funds instead of us. The commentator’s bottom line seemed to be that we were not a big city parish and were never going to have the budget and service of a big city parish, so it was foolish to act that way.

First off, we made a mistake in setting up the suggestion box without explaining that a name and phone number should be left with any comments. It is not constructive to the leadership and community of a parish for people not to be identified in making

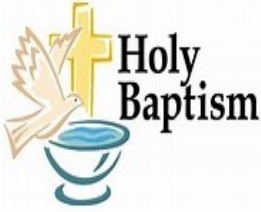
their comments. Much of what is left anonymously (not necessarily this particular commentator) is worded in uncharitable ways and less than constructive. In the case of this commentator, it would have been good to be able to call him or her and have a conversation about the issue. As I have said before, I welcome such conversations! However, members of the Steering Committee say that there are others making similar comments in conversations with them, so this offers a strong opportunity to clear some of these things up.

I have already addressed much of the commentator’s concerns in the past bulletin column in which I explained our plans. The comment actually seemed to indicate that the person had read that column, but simply disagreed with everything I had to say. It happens. In any event, a few points:

- 1.) The majority of engaged and giving members of the parish had actually been pushing for us to have a capital campaign for the past two years.
- 2.) The Archdiocese of Omaha, as a condition of pursuing a capital campaign, requires any parish to retain the services of a professional fundraising firm to do a feasibility study. In the case of the firm we have employed for this, For the Greater, their study cost is \$9,000, an extreme bargain for such work as parishioners and committee members aware of how non-profit fundraising works have attested.
- 3.) In order to proceed with a capital campaign, our feasibility study will need to produce very positive results. In this process, For the Greater seeks to gauge the parish temperature in a number of areas, beyond donations and volunteerism.
- 4.) If we do a capital campaign, we do not have the personnel on the ground to run it well by ourselves. I understand that St. Michael’s had a past bad experience with a capital campaign years ago in which many of the pledged funds were not collected and the consulting company was still paid. That was not a typical parish experience. What virtually always happens is that the efficiency and know-how of the consulting company leads to such a strong increase of giving than would have been otherwise that it more than pays for itself. Not only do they have the expertise and experience to handle the hundreds of details of a campaign, but they generally produce far superior results. For the Greater will charge us a flat fee of \$76,000 if we do the campaign – once again, an eye-popping bargain by industry standards. As I said, we will not do the campaign unless the feasibility study suggests that we can raise many times that amount.
- 5.) As I explained in the earlier column, we have the 8th-highest Sunday Mass attendance in the Archdiocese of Omaha. We may not be located in a big city – although that’s strongly debatable with South Sioux City being a suburb of what would be Nebraska’s 3rd-largest city – but we are in reality larger than the vast majority of the parishes in the city of Omaha.
- 6.) Our prior staff situation and having only one priest (the situation in which the commentator felt we were “doing fine”) was a crisis/emergency situation. Thanks be to God, the crisis has passed. Those recovering from an accident don’t remain in the ICU the rest of their lives when their condition improves. It’s time for St. Michael’s to exist as a living parish again.
- 7.) As explained, prior to Chrissy being hired, much of the work of the parish simply wasn’t done. We are still behind on some of these things and struggle to fulfill the day-to-day needs of our parishioners through the office. That cannot be sustained.

..... 8.) We simply cannot continue more than a year without at the very least hiring a full-time maintenance person, which will be quite expensive. We have been relying greatly on volunteers, and those volunteers are of an age that they won't be able to do this much longer.

9.) The archdiocese expects parishes to move from maintenance to mission in their structure and approach. I will explain more of what that means over time. Essentially, it requires a lot more work to be done in the parish, and a good deal of that is paid work. If we stay where we are now instead of moving forward toward this, we will be acting as a parish in defiance of the vision of the archdiocese. As a shepherd answer-

ble to God, I'm not willing to do that.

10.) As far as waiting on projects, that may well happen. You all will have the opportunity to express your opinions on what is important and what is unimportant for St. Michael's in the feasibility study. However, I think some of the projects are fairly urgent because they have a safety component to them.

Once again, I encourage everyone to participate in the interviews and surveys for the feasibility study. While one person's voice will not "win the day," the comments of everyone taken together will shape a lot of what we do or don't do. Please pray that the Lord will guide this process and show us the path ahead. May God bless you all.

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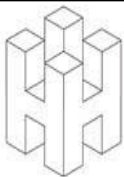
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
