• **Q: Can I receive the HOPE Scholarship at an out-of-state college?**

A: No. The HOPE Scholarship must be used at a postsecondary institution in Tennessee. For a list of eligible institutions visit tn.gov/tncollegepays.

• **Q: How is my high school GPA for the HOPE Scholarship calculated?**

A: HOPE GPAs are calculated per the Uniform Grading Policy adopted by the TN State Board of Education. For further details please ask your high school counselor.

• **Q: May I take a gap year after high school and remain eligible for HOPE?**

A: Yes. However, students must enroll at a regionally accredited college within 16 months of high school graduation.

• **Q: Is the FAFSA the only way to apply for the HOPE Scholarship?**

A: Yes, and it must be submitted every year the student enrolls in college.

• **Q: If I lose HOPE in college due to grades, can I regain it?**

A: Yes, students may regain the award one time at a future 24-hour benchmark if lost due to grades. Please contact your financial aid office, you will permanently lose your HOPE scholarship.

• **Q: How will my HOPE eligibility be affected if I decide to drop a course or two?**

A: Unless a leave of absence has been approved by your financial aid office, you will permanently lose your HOPE scholarship.

• **Q: How will my HOPE eligibility be affected if I decide to speak to your financial aid office before dropping any classes as this could cause permanent loss of HOPE and other aid.**

- Apply to the Tennessee Promise program at tnpromise.gov by November 1, 2019.
- Complete the 2020-2021 FAFSA at fafsa.gov by February 1, 2020 (2020-21 FAFSA application available October 1, 2019).
- Attend one mandatory meeting coordinated by your county's partnering organization.
- Complete 8 hours of community service between November 2, 2019 - July 1, 2020.
- Enroll in a Community College or Technical College the fall semester after senior year.

2020-2021 FAFSA

What is the FAFSA?
FAFSA stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid, and it's the form that determines eligibility for federal loans, grants and work-study funds for college and graduate students. It's administered by the U.S. Department of Education, which is the largest provider of student financial aid in the nation. In Tennessee, we also use FAFSA to administer state aid. It's the application for the HOPE Scholarship and an important step in being eligible for TN Promise.

Who should fill it out?
Every college student in Tennessee should complete the FAFSA. Most traditional high school and college-aged students will use their parents' information on the FAFSA. To see if you need to provide parent information on the FAFSA, visit studentaid.gov.

When does the FAFSA open?

The 2020-2021 FAFSA will be available on October 1, 2019 at fafsa.gov. FAFSA and upload tax information using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool.

What do I need to complete the FAFSA?

- Student's Social Security number
- Parent(s) Social Security number(s), if you have one
- Student's driver's license number, if you have one
- 2018 tax information for student and parent(s)
- Most parents/student will upload their 2018 tax information using IRS Data Retrieval Tool via FAFSA
- Records of your unmet income such as child support and veterans nonreduction benefits for student and parent(s)
- Asset information such as checking and savings account balances, investments, business and farm assets

HOW TO GET THE DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT

- Talk to your school counselor to find your best fit college for dual enrollment.
- Complete and submit the Dual Enrollment Grant application online at tn.gov/tsacstudentportal by the date for each semester as indicated.
- Apply for and meet admissions criteria for dual enrollment for the eligible postsecondary institution where you will enroll.

Tips for Creating a FSA ID

Do I need an email account to create a FSA ID?
Not necessarily, however, it is strongly encouraged to verify your information you use when creating a FSA ID to electronically sign the FSA ID for multiple purposes in the coming years so be sure you can remember the information you use to create a FSA ID. You will use your Social Security Administration and errors, especially with SSN, birthdate or name will cause delay.

When should I create a FSA ID?
You can create a FSA ID at any time. You can create the FSA ID one before, we recommend you do so at least 3 days BEFORE filing the FAFSA or attending FAFSA completion event.

Who should create a FSA ID?
The student AND parent will both need to create separate usernames and passwords at studentaid.gov.

What is the FSA ID?
The FSA ID is a username and password that you will use to log into certain U.S. Department of Education websites, and electronically sign the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

- Enter your information accurately. Your information will be verified by the Social Security Administration and errors, especially with SSN, birthdate or name will cause delay.
- Please write down the information used to create a FSA ID. You will use your FSA ID for multiple purposes in the coming years so be sure you can remember the information you use when creating a FSA ID. Keep this information in a safe place such as with your tax information.
- Remember that an email address can only be linked with one FSA ID. Students and parents CANNOT use the same email address.
- Do not use your high school email account. Typically these will expire after graduation and you'll need to access your FSA ID for several years after high school.
- It is important to have access to your email and phone when creating a FSA ID. A secure code will be sent to both your email address and your cell phone. Entering this code will verify your email address and phone number and can be used if you forget your FSA ID username and/or password.
