# **Pursuing Her Passion: Laurie Rud's Story**

"Everybody on?!" Her exuberant
shout can be heard throughout the
tour bus she's guiding today. As a
New York City Tour Guide, Laurie
Rud likes to use her tours as a
stage. Her knowledge of the city,
architecture and attractions is
second to none and Laurie will
excite you and persuade you into
booking a magical tour of your own
whenever you come to visit New
York City. Be certain to look her up!

Laurie loves the activity and excitement and allure of New York City. She's been there since 2004 and though she adores Minnesota and the "lake life," she's not intending to leave her life in The Big Apple anytime soon. Laurie's days are filled with her tour business, guiding public and private tours, and tending to her busy social life. She's a Broadway Theater addict and a freelance film producer... in her spare time, of course. She is a cat lover and has two black cats who allow her to share their space, Simon and Emma.

But let's back up and take a look at what led Laurie to the excitement of NYC and her life there. Laurie began her education right here in Warren, Minnesota. While growing up she was an active member of the Triangle 4-H Club and the Marshall County 4-H Federation. She attended WHS, along with her older sister, Lynnae (WHS Class of '81). Laurie grew up on a farm southeast of Warren where her parents still reside. As a member of the Class of '89, Laurie, like so many Minnesota girls, dreamed of bigger and brighter things. As a young kindergarten student, Laurie, along with her class, attended the dress rehearsal for "The Sound of Music" production at the high school. Laurie remembers being "mesmerized" by the performance and production. She

didn't realize it then, but it would be a beginning of her love of theater and the arts. As a "Pony," Laurie speaks fondly of her beginnings here in Minnesota. One large attraction for her at the time was the music/drama department, led by Mark Maruska. Laurie participated both in "Brigadoon" and "Guys & Dolls" while in high school and instantly knew she had a passion for musicals and dreamed of the lights of Broadway.

Laurie was the senior class president, so she planned both the 10 and 20 year class reunions for her class and worked alongside Krissy (Craig) Potucek and others to put together the 30-year reunion, which was last summer during the All School Reunion.

One of the most memorable events for Laurie that occurred while attending WHS, included a trip to the Twin Cities, where she, along with Mrs. Dalzell and Suzie Jevning, saw two shows at the Guthrie Theater. This furthered her interest in theater and arts. But, it doesn't stop there for Laurie and her experiences at WHS. She knew she was unique and she was proud of being different. In 7th grade, she made the brave decision to start breaking the mold. Laurie visited with Erv Kallstrom and stepped out of the box by joining WHS Pony Wrestling as the team manager, a role she'd hold through her sophomore year. Laurie commented that she liked traveling with the team. Mr. Kallstrom and the wrestling program went on to remain a fond memory of her high school career. Additionally, Laurie enjoyed being on the yearbook staff and was a photographer for the WAHISEAN, a role she enjoyed very much. Superintendent Mel Hanson trained her how to use the darkroom. She used her skills in writing and photography, as her first job was working for the Warren Sheaf writing articles, taking pictures and developing film.

When contemplating influences in her life, Laurie was eager to talk about John Johnson as one of those individuals who helped her learn to live her dreams. Through him, Laurie participated in the Minnesota Governor's Scholar program. As part of this program, she attended a leadership conference in the Twin Cities and planned a senior project that included teaching Spanish to fifth graders and hosting a pizza party for high school A honor roll students as a way to give back, inspire others and contribute to the

Following her high school years, Laurie entered the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis/St. Paul with the intention of earning a degree in the field of journalism, like her boss at the Sheaf, E. Neil Mattson. Her passion began to evolve and she worked with professors to develop an independent program combining journalism, theater and English. While attending the U of M, she had an opportunity to study abroad, so Laurie, along with other U of M students and a pair of teacher assistants, packed their bags, loaded themselves up and headed to London to participate in a Shakespeare program. While there she had the opportunity to intern at the theater and helped with a production. Laurie was becoming hooked on the allure of the theater and all that goes on behind the scenes to create a production.

Throughout college, Laurie found herself working in retail management in Minneapolis. She loved it, but found herself craving more. In 2000, Laurie decided to follow her dream of acting so she signed up to take acting classes at the Guthrie. She auditioned and got into the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in Los Angeles, California. She was on her way to making her dreams come true. After being there for a year, Laurie met a private acting teacher and kept taking classes, including improv from Melissa McCarthy's husband, Ben Falcone. Laurie stayed in LA for four years, but became tired of all the driving. In 2004, on a whim, Laurie decided to sell her car and headed to NYC in October.

When she first arrived in NYC, she did a bit of extra work on shows like the Sopranos and Saturday Night Live and films "The Departed" and "Margaret." She also appeared on an episode of Cash Cab. Around that time, she took the test to become a tour guide. While she was doing tours, she had a part time job that had an opportunity in London. She jumped at the chance to live in London again and stayed there from September 2007 through June of 2008, but she found herself having dreams of doing tours in New York City." Laurie knew then that New York would be her "home." She moved back there and found herself doing a few tours and working for a non-profit. In the long run, tours have won out.

Greetings from the Warren/Alvarado/Oslo/ Public School Education Foundation!

As I write this we are in the midst of a cold cycle. We've had snow, a WAO Snow Day, rain, more rain, warm temps, dryness, and almost every imaginable kind of weather since July. Our farmers are frantically working to get the bean and corn crops harvested. The beet harvest has been halted.

The summer of 2019 was a busy time with the All School Reunion, various class gatherings, the Marshall County Fair, and our 15th Annual Golf Scramble. We were in awe of our generous sponsors, donors, and 183 golfers who contributed to our golf scramble on July 26th. We cleared \$28,000. Wow! Thank you! Mark your calendars for July 24th for our 2020 event. Registrations are open for 2020 at this time. Send us your name and team members to get on the list!

In addition to the golf scramble, we held a raffle where only 100 tickets were sold at \$100 each. The winners were Shari Swanson-\$500, Nola Lindgren-\$500, and Jason Clark-\$4,000. The \$5,000 that the Foundation made will be used for classroom needs/requests, and for the scholarships that we fund.

The All-School Reunion program that was held on the afternoon of July 27th showcased many alumni as the MCs, the reunion choir director and pianist, and all members of the choir that sang, the homecoming queens over the years, volunteers, participants in the program and the Hall of Fame inductees. Special congratulations to Donald Mager (ALV '53), Lyle (WHS '78) & Tim (WHS '81) Palm, Ervin Rokke (WHS '57) and Dr. Harold Scheie (WHS '26) who were inducted into the WAO Hall of Fame.

This fall we facilitated \$23,176 in

classroom needs for the district.
These are all items that are over and above what the district budgets for. All personnel were given the opportunity to submit requests for items that they would like to use for their classroom or department.

In addition we funded \$1,620 from the CJ Anderson Endowment for the Scholastic Book Program for grades kindergarten, 2, 4, 5, and 6. This provides each child in the classroom with a monthly book at their grade level. Preschool, grades 1 and 3 had theirs donated by an outside individual or organization. For some of the students this is the first book that they've been able to receive from a book order to take home to keep!

Each of the new full time WAO staff members received a \$200 gift from the Foundation for supplies that they wished to purchase for their classroom. In addition each received a \$50 gift certificate for "Pony" gear from the WAO Wearhouse.

Have you purchased or received a copy of the WAO Education Foundation Cookbook that came out last December? It is filled with a wide variety of recipes from alumni, current staff/students and friends. They are available in many Warren businesses or at the school for \$15. We can mail them out to you for a total of \$20. This would make a perfect holiday or hostess gift. Proceeds from cookbook purchases will be used to fund items for the district.

During American Education Week this month we served lunch for all school personnel to thank them for all that they do for us and for our students!


