IMPORTANT

Bus Route:

NEWSLETTER COVER SHEET

Starting next week. In order to make sure parents/guardians are receiving our newsletter and other important information we send out in paper form, we will be sending home the newsletter with a cover sheet to be signed and returned back to the school with your oldest student. As a thank you for returning the filled out cover sheet your student(s) will receive a treat. If you have more than one student attending Evaline, we will send the newsletter home with the eldest sibling.

Attestation Yellow Slips:

Please remember to complete the yellow attestation slip and send it with your student every day they attend school. If you are in need of more, please contact the office.

What to Bring: Please have your student bring the following: **backpack, charged chromebook and cord, headphones, water bottle, mask, school supplies including workbooks, and coats/sweatshirts.**

Masks: Masks are required for anyone to enter or remain in the school building unless they have a doctor's note allowing for an alternate safety option. If a student is unable or unwilling to wear a mask they are still able to participate in learning at Evaline School using the distance learning resources. We will be providing "Mask Breaks" to assist with the adjustment to wearing masks for a longer period of time.

Student Drop Off: For parents who are choosing to drop off their students, **please do so between 8:15-8:25** using the front driveway loop, following the signs posted. Students can be dropped off at either the **office door for Grades 3 and 4** or the **front door for grades K,1,2,5 and 6**. Please drop them off with their completed and signed health attestation slip. **The bus will arrive at 8:30AM. When the bus arrives, any drop off students not having exited their vehicles yet, will need to wait in their vehicles until the bus has been fully unloaded and moved while the passengers are checked in by family group.** Do not unload your vehicle during this time, please wait in your vehicle until you can pull up to your student's entrance.

Bus Schedule/Protocols:

1. **The bus will run Monday through Thursday.** You may see the bus stop or drive by your house even if it is not your day to attend school. Please note that we will follow the schedule as closely as possible, but trains and slow borders may impact the schedule. **Please have your child(ren) ready at their designated bus stop at least 5 minutes prior to pick up time, and like- wise plan to be at their drop off stop 5 minutes prior to drop off.**

2. **ATTESTATION ON THE BUS:** Students will be expected to wear a mask and have their **completed attestation slip** to turn in to the bus aide when they get on the bus.

Student Dismissal/Pick Up: We will need to load the bus and have it depart before we begin to send students out to cars for pick up due to necessary safety protocols. We will **begin loading the bus prior to 2pm to allow the bus to have a planned departure time of 2pm.** We will then plan to start dismissal of students by family group to the Home Line beginning at 2:05pm. **We ask that you not arrive to line up until at least 2pm, and that you line up using the front loop only.** We will have signs to help with this process. **We ask that you remain in your vehicles for both drop off and pick up.**

Please give at least a 1 hour notice for any change to a prearranged plan for bus versus pickup / drop off plan due to safety and logistical reasons.

Super Second Graders Weekly Update:

ixl:

Families, please help ensure your child completes his/her weekly "Recommended Skills." These are aligned with grade level skills and enforce grade level reading and comprehension concepts. Weekly ixl skills are also a wonderful tool to keep both our remote and in-person learners synchronized.

To get to the week's assigned skills students log into ixl. They will see the "Recommendations" home page. To the right of "Recommendations" students will see an oval with a yellow star and "Number Suggestions from your teacher." Click on this oval and work through the week's assigned skills.

Epic/AR/ and Fluency Reads:

We have read over 190 books on Epic and taken an astounding 106 AR tests! Keep it up! Please read for at least 30 minutes every day. Students should read and test on the books I loaned them then return the books at the end of the week. Once students return the books I can send new ones home the following week.

Families, thank you to those who have been timing your child's weekly cold fluency read. Please time your child for 60 seconds as s/he reads the assigned reading passage once through. Your child is not expected to complete the passage; rather circle the last word s/he read when the 60 second time is up. These fluency reads give me a really important, consistent data point to track growth and intervention. The time you spend ensuring these are accurate and turned in is greatly appreciated!

Science and Social Studies:

This week students completed their Chapter 1 Review. They also looked at magnetism and simple machines. Next week we will begin a study on sound.

In social studies we continued to look at citizenship; building on our knowledge of a U.S. citizen's rights and responsibilities. We talked about what a representative democracy is and what its values are. It is hoped that these ideas have paved the way for us to begin lessons on U.S. elections. We will not be discussing candidates in the second grade; rather we will be looking at the electoral process.

ELA and Math:

Second graders have completed their first ELA unit and are wrapping up their second math unit!

Student Super Power of the Week:

Our Student Super Power of the Week was Growth Mindset! We spent the week distinguishing between fixed and growth mindsets. In the coming weeks we will get into the specifics of growth mindset with a focus next week on the idea that everyone can learn!

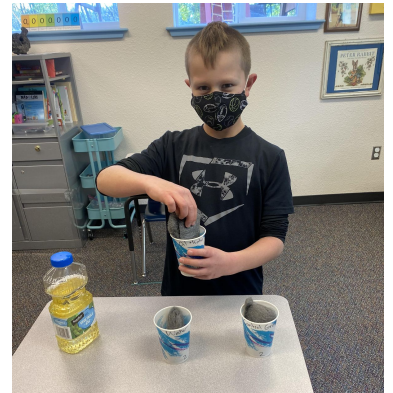
Hello families,

It has been **SO great** to have our Fabulous Fourth Graders back in the building this week. They have been working very hard... and enjoying some socially distanced recess time as well! We have spent our 8th week focused on completing and reviewing concepts covered earlier in the year in Math and ELA, as well as introducing Spelling, and diving further into Science, with a focus on Energy. Please ask your student to tell you about kinetic & potential energy, and their experiment using a ping pong ball this week. This was a fun interactive way to learn about the subject, and be able to share observations and results.

We want to remind students and their families that on the weekdays that they are not in the school building participating in face to face learning, they should still be working on assignments presented at school, as well as working on programs on their chromebook such as iXL, XMath, and AR. These are due, completed, on their next scheduled day back in the building.

This week your student began using their Planners as a place to write assignments that need to be completed at home, as well as to send a note home to a parent/ guardian. Please make sure they have it each day when they come to school, and check it each day they come home, so you know how to better support their learning. We are still working on what system will work the best for documenting assignments in a timely manner, so please be patient as we make adjustments along the way.

Since all Fourth Grade students are back in face to face learning, we will discontinue the ZOOM meetings Monday-Thursday, but on Fridays, when all students are working from home, we will have a required ALL Fourth Grade Class ZOOM meeting from 10:00AM - 11:00AM. The first portion will be purely fun, and gives a chance for all Fourth Graders to interact with each other, and share feelings, experiences, and things on their mind. Then we will share any reminders we have related to their homework or their next scheduled day in class. Students can sign off at that point, or they can remain on ZOOM, or return to the ZOOM meeting, for homework help by Mrs. Fletcher or Mrs. Duren until 11:00AM.
