- 1) Teachers make level recommendations in PowerSchool. Students are strongly encouraged to follow teacher recommendations. If students want to request a different level, they should speak to their current teacher.
 - If teachers agree with a different level, they can change their recommendation in PowerSchool.
 - If teachers do <u>not</u> agree, students should see their School Counselor to discuss and complete the "Request for Change in Level" form and return to Guidance by **February 11, 2022**. "Request for Change in Level" forms returned after the deadline will not be reviewed until the beginning of the school year.
- 2) Review the 9th Grade 2022-2023 Course # Reference Sheet.
- 3) Review the Class of 2026 Graduation Requirements and Typical 9th Grade Schedule.
- 4) View descriptions and prerequisites in the *Program of Studies* which can be found online at the RHHS website (https://rhhs.rockyhillps.com/docsandlinks).
- 5) Students will select courses online through PowerSchool (https://rockyhill.powerschool.com/public/) for the 2022-2023 school year by **February 11, 2022**..
- 6) Select a minimum of **7.25 credits**, plus at least one alternative course (either one full-year or two ½ year classes in both Semester 1 and Semester 2) to serve as a backup to your first elective. *IMPORTANT: All students must select courses for next year since the master schedule is generated by these requests. Otherwise, there is no guarantee that courses will be offered.*
- 7) NOTE: Honors level English students will be required to complete summer prerequisite reading. The honors class will have a specific novel to read and detailed note taking requirements. Before students leave for the summer, a packet will be issued on where to find specific course materials and requirements. When students return to school, students should be prepared to actively discuss and complete assignments related to the text.
- 8) Any student who has <u>not</u> completed the course selection process by February 11, 2022 may not be enrolled in their preferred electives or classes. If students do not make selections by the deadline, counselors will add recommended academic/core classes and randomly select electives.
- 9) Individual meetings to verify schedules for next year with Counselors will be scheduled late spring this is the only opportunity to make any changes to the schedule. <u>Students may not make any changes to their schedule after the last day of school without administrative approval.</u>
- 10) Students who are interested in playing Division I or II athletics in college should start preparing as early as freshman year. Students must meet very specific academic requirements, as noted on the NCAA website (http://www.ncaa.org/student-athletes/future/how-register). Students can view NCAA approved RHHS classes by going to https://web3.ncaa.org/hsportal/exec/hsAction. Search by the school name or CEEB/ACT code (070648).
