Helping Verbs

is has does could be must can would have do will been may are shall had did should might being am was were

Identifying Linking Verbs

Linking verbs <u>do not show action</u>. They connect the subject of the verb to more information about the subject.

Sentence with action verb Action Subject Verb Object John is texting his friends.

Sentences with linking verbs Link- (Noun) ing Subject Subject Verb Complement Lisa was a student.

(Adjective) Linking Subject Subject Verb Complement The course *seems* interesting.

Identifying Helping Verbs

Helping verbs (or auxiliary verbs) come before the main verb in a sentence. They assist the main verb, showing time and meaning.

Helping Main Subject Verb Verb Object John *is* doing the assignment. (Action in progress)

Helping Subject Verb Main Verb Object John has completed the assignment. (Action completed before now)

Helping Main Prepositional Subject Verb Verb Phrase The group *can* meet at the library. (Potential action)

Helping Subject Verb Main Verb Object Lisa *must* complete the application. (Obligatory action)
