
- Take turns reading aloud together.




MILESTONE 2: YOUR CHILD CAN READ INDEPENDENTLY, AND ENJOYS READING A VARIETY OF BOOKS.

Provide different kinds of reading materials geared to his interests (a kids sports magazine, or books on the hobbies or other activities he loves).
Treat your child like a reading expert, for instance, say: "You've been reading a lot of those mystery story books. Which one do you think is best? Why?"

•Provide your child with some free time every day to relax and read.

•<u>Keep reading aloud</u> to your child (to strengthen his vocabulary, comprehension, and listening skills, as well as his enjoyment of reading).
