Dear parishioners,

In our second reading from St. Paul’s Second Letter to Timothy, we encounter Paul in chains for the sake of the Gospel, but he is not beaten. He definitely has his chin up. Why? Because his sufferings are useful in bringing salvation to others as they come to believe in Christ. Paul also notes that “God is not chained.” He also says, “If we have died with (Christ) we shall also live with Him; if we persevere, we shall also reign with Him. But if we deny Him, He will deny us. If we are unfaithful, He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself.” What does Paul mean when He says that Jesus “cannot deny Himself?” I thought Jesus was God. Can’t He do everything?

God is all-knowing, all-powerful, all-good. He is also the ground of reality. He created everything and holds everything in being. When Jesus says that He is the truth as well as the way and the life, He is able to say that by very virtue of being God the Son, the Word of God. We believe that the revelation of Jesus which we have received through the Church throughout the ages is reality and the truth.

Jesus is more than the source of our salvation; He is also all reality, all goodness, all love. The ancient He had not risen from the dead and was not the Messiah. However, to do such a thing was to lie, as well as to say no to God’s love and salvation. If death was the price for telling the truth and clinging to Christ’s salvation, then so be it, because God promised the gift of a far more joyful and endless life.

Jesus is integrity itself. The evil one, on the other hand, is often called the father of lies. Lying is never holy, and is often identified as “the one thing God cannot do.” To say this isn’t putting some sort of limit on God, but rather proclaiming His integrity and love. Why can’t Jesus just forgive Christians if they deny Him, since He is so loving? Because He cannot deny Himself. He remains faithful to the truth of God, and to the reality of what His salvation is. To reject Jesus’ love by denying Him under pressure is a simply gigantic sin. Fortunately, the Church has in fact discerned that even this greatest of sins is forgivable if one repents and turns back to the Lord. The only unforgivable sin is the sin against the Holy Spirit – the very denial of God’s mercy and His willingness to forgive if we repent, often manifested in a refusal to repent. But although the denial of Christ may be forgiven if we are repentant, we must acknowledge it as the huge sin it is.

We see in the Church and in our world today a tremendous push for mercy, to reach out to all others in a way that lets them know of God’s love and mercy. This makes a great deal of sense – as my father taught me, “You attract a lot more flies with honey than vinegar.” Moreover, God’s love and mercy offered to us through the sacrifice of Christ is the Gospel itself which we ought to proclaim. However, at some point in reaching out to others, there must be an acknowledgement that some of their life choices or activities by their very nature may be blocking them from the full capacity to receive God’s love – holding to another religion instead of to the truth of Christ, trying to mix another religion with Christianity, racist views or ideology, living a lifestyle of engaging in same-gender genital acts or relationships, living as if married without being married, being divorced and remarried with no efforts toward the freedom within the Church to do so, public support for abortion to be legal and/or as being morally acceptable, belief in modern gender theory, domestic abuse, the use of contraception or sterilization, using in vitro fertilization, or consistent and unrepentant engagement in addictive behaviors.

God’s truth is linked to, and one with, His love. Jesus has taught us from the beginning through His own words, through the apostles, and through the Church that these life actions and choices are not consistent with living in the love of God and in fact bring tremendous hurt into the world and into people’s lives.

God wants these people to abandon these idols in favor of the

freedom, joy, and abundant life He offers them. If we, as members of the Church, lie to others about the truth of Jesus Christ, or refuse to present that truth at any point in our outreach to them, we sin gravely against that truth, as well as withholding the kingdom of God from others.

The fruits of the Holy Spirit include kindness, goodness, patience, peace, and love. If we seek always to live in the Spirit ourselves, then we can reach out to others both within and outside of the Church with the love of Christ in a way that draws them toward the fullness of the abundant life that God wants for them. May God always give us the courage and strength to do so.

Last week, during the 1:30 Mass, I acknowledged a number of frustrations I have about things happening during our Sunday Masses – 1) we still evidently have children or adolescents who are vandalizing the paint outside of the church bathroom as they wait to use the restroom; 2) several adolescents are standing in the hallway behind the pews in the back of the church, using their cell phones or visiting irreverently with each other instead of being seated in the pews and paying attention – for all intents and purposes being in the church building without really attending Mass at all; and 3) parishioners disobeying and/or disrespecting our ushers when they offer help or ask something of them.

Attendance at Mass isn’t just a matter of being present at or in a building during a certain time. It is an attitude of the heart, of being engaged in prayer, worship, and thanksgiving toward God and listening to His voice. Sitting in the pews helps us to sing and participate in responses as we ought as well as engaging our bodies in the postures of worship (standing, sitting, or kneeling). It helps us to act as members of Christ’s flock. I acknowledge that some may wish to stand during Mass due to medical problems, especially of an orthopedic nature. However, I would ask a number of things from all parishioners:

- 1.) If you are under the age of 19 and able-bodied, I would request of you, without exception, to sit in the pews if there is any physical room for you whatsoever, of which the ushers will be the judge.
- 2.) Please be respectful to our ushers. They are volunteers who dedicate their time and service to God’s people. They don’t deserve to be disrespected by you – and especially if their manner in approaching and asking things of you is itself polite and respectful.
- 3.) Please make the effort to “bathroom” your children before coming to Mass so that they do not have to use the restroom during Mass. If they do have to use the restroom, please have an adult accompany them for the sake of their safety and discipline. Please be extremely attentive to ensure that they are not destroying the paint on the walls outside the bathroom. Also note that, since people ought not at all to be congregating in the small passageway from the back hallway to the restroom and the choir, this is another reason why we need to keep that back hallway on the north side clear – in case there happen to be more than one person/child at a time who needs to use the restroom, so that they have a place to wait. Meanwhile, the south back hallway ought not to be blocked so that people in the cry room can see the altar.
- 4.) St. Michael’s Church is in the process of implementing a safety plan for our Sunday Masses. Obedience to and respect toward the ushers and general order during Mass will be extremely important to its implementation. Following the requests I am making at this point will be an important step toward this.

The Church belongs to all of us, and we seek to worship God as one body in Christ. Let us be respectful and supportive toward one another as He draws us into communion with one another.
